Dear Ms. Salak:

Some pricing information was inadvertently left out of Sprint's proposal covering the new FCC Rules and Orders submitted this day. In the pricing section of the proposal, information concerning the lump sum payment amounts for the two option years is missing.

Under Pricing Option II, if the State chooses to pay for the FCC upgrades in a lump sum, the lump sum payment for the 1^{st} option year (ending May 31, 2004) is \$795,000. The lump sum payment for the 2^{nd} option year (ending May 31, 2005) is \$810,000.
