NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER GRANTING CERTIFICATE TO PROVIDE INTEREXCHANGE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICE

BY THE COMMISSION:

Dot Com Phone Cards, LLC ("Dot Com")has applied for a certificate to provide Interexchange Telecommunications (IXC) service. Upon review of its application, it appears that Dot Com has sufficient technical, financial, and managerial capability to provide such service, as required under Section 364.337(3), Florida Statutes. Accordingly, we hereby grant Certificate No. 7632 to Dot Com Phone Cards, LLC.

If this Order becomes final and effective, it shall serve as Dot Com's certificate. It should, therefore, be retained by Dot Com as proof of certification.

IXCs are subject to Chapter 25-24, Florida Administrative Code, Part X, Rules Governing Telephone Service Provided by Interexchange Telephone Companies. IXCs are also required to comply with all applicable provisions of Chapter 364, Florida Statutes, and Chapters 25-4, Florida Administrative Code.

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In addition, under Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, certificate holders must pay a minimum annual Regulatory Assessment Fee of \$50 if the certificate was active during any portion of the calendar year. A RAFs Return notice for 2000 will be mailed to Dot Com. Neither the cancellation of its certificate nor the failure to receive a RAFs Return notice for the year 2000 shall relieve Dot Com from its obligation to pay RAFs for 2000.

Based on the foregoing,

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that we hereby grant to Dot Com Phone Cards, LLC Certificate No. 7632, subject to the terms and conditions specified in the body of this Order. It is further

ORDERED that this Order shall serve as Dot Com Phone Cards, LLC's certificate and should be retained by Dot Com Phone Cards, LLC as proof of certification. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Director, Division of Records and Reporting, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings or Judicial Review" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, this Docket shall be closed.
