On October 19, 2000, the Commission's staff held a customer meeting at the Gem Estates' Clubhouse. At that meeting, it was discussed how staff initiated their preliminary recommendation for this rate case. Let me take this opportunity to briefly explain how the Florida Public Service Commission establishes rates. Pursuant to Section 367.081, Florida Statutes, the Commission shall set rates which are just, reasonable, compensatory, and are not unfairly discriminatory. In determining the revenue requirements for the water and wastewater services, the Commission employs the rate of return methodology established in Chapter 367, Florida Statutes. This ratemaking process is used for all water and wastewater companies and is also used in the electric and gas industry. It is the same approach used throughout the country by various state and federal utility regulatory bodies.

There are many factors that affect the cost of providing service and hence, the rates charged to customers. Some of the factors affecting the cost of providing service include the size and age of the utility system, the quality of the water at its source, the number of customers, and the geographic spread of the service area. During a rate case, the Commission's accountants, engineers and economists examine the financial and engineering information filed by companies as part of a rate increase application. The Commission's auditors also examine this information and publish the results of their findings in an audit report. Recovery of any costs found by the Commission to be imprudent or unreasonable is not allowed. Once the revenue requirement is set, the Commission must then establish service rates which will afford the utility the opportunity to earn the approved revenue requirement.

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AGREEMENT FOR AHENDMENT OF COVENANTS UCO467-100

the parties to this Agreement include the Marjorie R. Cahill Trust, the owner of property identified as Gem Estates Mobile Home recorded at Official Record Book 825, Page 398-407, Village. (hereafter "developer") and the undersigned purchaser(s) of a lot in the Gem Estates subdivision, whose name and lot number are set forth upon execution of this document at the time and date indicated (hereafter "lot owner").

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This Agreement is entered into between the parties for the purpose of resolving a dispute involving the provision of certain services, as described more fully below, and providing the duty to pay for those services in a manner which will be binding on the parties and be a covenant running with the land as if set forth fully in the Deed of Easements, Restrictions and Reservations recorded at Official Record Book 825, Page 398-407 in Pasco County, Florida, and reviewable, renewable or amendable in 1993 at the same time and in the same manner as set forth therein. Provided that the covenants contained in this agreement may be reviewed, renewed, or amended by 60% of the lot owners rather than the 80% required in the original deed restrictions.

This Agreement is an amendment to the Deed of Easements. Restrictions and Reservations recorded at Official Record Book 825. Page 398-407 in Pasco County, Florida for the lot number set forth below to have the same legal effect as if set forth fully in that document at the time of purchase. It is intended that upon execution of this Agreement by the parties here to that this Agreement will be recorded in the public records of Pasco County for the property and be a covenant running with the land for the purpose of binding the heirs, successors and assigns of the parties.

Developer agrees to provide recreational facilities, including recreation hall, common areas and shuffleboard courts. the electricity for street lighting, an area for recreational vehicle storage and water service to include a supply of potable drinking. water which meets all state and local health and environmental standards for human consumption. Developer agrees to make all necessary incidental repairs to the interior of the demised premises and to maintain the property, including the water well and piping, recreational facilities and the common areas.

Developer agrees to make all exterior repairs, including repairs of the roof of the recreational building, shuffleboard courts, water piping, water well and pressure system, as well as repairs as, required because of water entering the premises from the roof or other parts of the building or other causes not under the Gem Estates' control. On January 1, 1991, and each annual term thereafter during the term of this Agreement, the annual payment will be only increased or decreased according to the annual percentage increase or decrease in the annual Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) given by the Government of the United State: to recipients of Social Security. The annual payment is due and owing on March 31 of each year and may be arranged to be paid in lump sum or in quarterly installments which are due on March 31, June 30. September 30, and December 31 of each year.

Enforcement of these provisions shall be by at law or in equity against any person or persons violating any provisions herein contained, either to restrain such violation or to recover damages.

The parties further agree that developer and the lot owner shall be governed by Chapter 723.037 and 723.038, Florida Statutes, with regard to any future dispute which may arise with respect to annual fees and services, and nothing contained in this agreement shall be construed to relieve either party from the statutory requirements contained therein.

The provisions herein contained are covenants running with the land and shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their heirs, legal representatives and assigns, and all parties claiming by, through or under them.

In response to your letter received by the Commission on October 27, 2000, I would like to take this opportunity to address your concerns. On October 19, 2000, the Commission's staff held a customer meeting at the Gem Estates' Clubhouse. At that meeting, it was discussed how staff initiated their preliminary recommendation for this rate case. Let me take this opportunity to briefly explain how the Florida Public Service Commission establishes rates. Pursuant to Section 367.081, Florida Statutes, the Commission shall set rates which are just, reasonable, compensatory, and are not unfairly discriminatory. In determining the revenue requirements for the water and wastewater services, the Commission employs the rate of return methodology established in Chapter 367, Florida Statutes. This ratemaking process is used for all water and wastewater companies and is also used in the electric and gas industry. It is the same approach used throughout the country by various state and federal utility regulatory bodies.

There are many factors that affect the cost of providing service and hence, the rates charged to customers. Some of the factors affecting the cost of providing service include the size and age of the utility system, the quality of the water at its source, the number of customers, and the geographic spread of the service area. During a rate case, the Commission's accountants, engineers and economists examine the financial and engineering information filed by companies as part of a rate increase application. The Commission's auditors also examine this information and publish the results of their findings in an audit report. Recovery of any costs found by the Commission to be imprudent or unreasonable is not allowed. Once the revenue requirement is set, the Commission must then establish service rates which will afford the utility the opportunity to earn the approved revenue requirement.

Your list of concerns received by the Commission on October 27, 2000 consists of the following:

- " Is there a penalty involved for the owner if the meters are not installed when scheduled?"
- " If the subdivision is bought by someone other than the homeowner's association... are these rates set or can they be juggled by the owner at the time the meters are installed?"

First, in its final recommendation to the Commission, staff will recommend that the installation of water meters be completed within six months of the date of the Commission's Order. If the recommendation is approved by the Commission and an Order is issued, pursuant to Chapter 367.161, Florida Statutes, any utility that fails to comply with Commission rules or orders may be subject to a penalty for each offense of not more than \$5,000 per day.

Second, pursuant to Chapter 367.022(2)(7), Florida Statutes, the following are not subject to regulation by the Commission as a utility or the provisions of this chapter: systems owned, operated, managed, or controlled by governmental authorities; or nonprofit corporations, associations, or cooperatives providing service solely to members who own and control such nonprofit groups. Therefore, if Gem Estates is purchased by any organization other than a government entity or a nonprofit organization, the rates and charges that are in place at the time of purchase will remain until the Commission grants its approval to revise them.

Further, staff is scheduled to submit a formal recommendation to the Commission on December 7, 2000, and the Commission vote on this matter is scheduled for December 19, 2000.
