Recovery Program for the 6 Months Ended March 31, 1998, Docket No. 980002-EG,

Document Nos. 11948-98 and 12622-98

On October 20, 1998, when copies of certain portions of staff's audit report and working papers regarding FPL's Energy Conservation Cost Recovery (ECCR) audit for the 6 Months Ended March 31, 1998, were delivered to the utility at the audit exit conference, the utility requested that these documents be temporarily excepted from public access in accordance with the provisions of Rule 25-22.006(3)(a)(2), Florida Administrative Code (FAC). On October 26, 1998, staff filed document 11948-98 consisting of those working papers. These documents are currently held by the Division of Records and Reporting and designated as temporarily exempt from public access. On November 10, 1998, the utility filed a request pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, FAC, and Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.), that selected portions of the staff audit report and working papers prepared by staff during the ECCR audit receive confidential classification. The utility's request included highlighted copies (Document 12622-98) and redacted copies (Document 12621-98) for public use.

Pursuant to Section 119.07, F. S., documents submitted to this Commission are public records. The only exemptions to this law are specific statutory exemptions and exemptions granted by governmental agencies pursuant to the specific terms of a statutory provision. Subsections 366.093(3)(d)(e) and (f), F.S., provide the following exceptions:

"Proprietary confidential business information means information, regardless of form or characteristics, which is owned or controlled by the person or company, is intended to be and is treated by the person or company as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to the ratepayers or the person's or company's business operations, and has not been disclosed unless disclosed pursuant to a statutory provision, an order of a court or administrative body, or private agreement that provides that the information will not be released to the public. Proprietary confidential business information includes, but is not limited to:....

(d) Information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms.

- (e) Information related to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information.
- (f) Employee Personnel Information unrelated to compensation, duties, qualifications, or responsibilities."

According to Section 366.093, F. S., and Rule 25-22.006, FAC, the utility has the burden of demonstrating that materials qualify for confidential classification. According to Rule 25-22.006, FAC, the utility must meet this burden by demonstrating that the information is proprietary confidential business information, the disclosure of which will cause the utility, the provider of the information or the ratepayer harm.

Staff Analysis of FPL's Request

Analysis of the utility's request and listing of confidential materials reveals the sensitive information presented in the filing consists of:

- 1) Names of customers (Competitive customer-specific information)
- 2) Customer account numbers (Competitive customer-specific information)
- 3) Names of vendors (Contractual information)
- 4) Invoice and Purchase Order Numbers (Contractual information)

According to the utility, the listed types of information represent customer-specific account information, information relating to ongoing litigation, or information concerning bids or contractual data. Utility witness Brandt, FPL Manager, Sales and Marketing Support, identifies by page and line which items report; (1) sensitive information regarding competitive interests; and (2) sensitive bid or contractual information. Utility witness Gampfer, FPL Manager, Information Project Planning and Architecture, reports additional information contained within the staff's working papers which report sensitive bid or contractual information.

5) Employee Social Security Numbers

Utility witness Thomas, FPL Manager, Payroll, reports that employee social security numbers contained on FPL documents obtained by the PSC staff during this audit qualify for confidential protection because the information is employee personnel information unrelated to compensation, duties, qualifications, or responsibilities.

Staff Recommendation

Customer-specific information regarding electric demand and energy data has been repeatedly treated by the Commission as qualifying for protection on the basis that the information is of a competitive nature wherein release of the information would cause the customer or the utility harm (Commission Order 22851, dated April 23, 1990). We recommend, consistent with prior policy, that the utility request to hold the customer names and the customer account numbers as confidential be granted.

As for contractual information, this type of sensitive information can cause harm to the utility or the vendor if it were publicly released; therefore sensitive contractual information qualifies for confidential protection pursuant to the listed exemption from public access provided by Section 366.093(3)(d), Florida Statutes. We recommend to grant, in accordance with a specific statutory exemption, that the utility's request to hold vendors names, invoice numbers and purchase order numbers as confidential.

The confidential status of employee social security numbers was recently addressed by the Commission in Order PSC-98-1024-CFO-EG, dated July 28, 1998;

"FPL maintains that the information ... is entitled to confidential classification. Normally partial employee social security numbers used merely for employee identification are not protected under Section 366.093, Florida Statutes. In this instance, however, the entire number can be derived from the portion provided. Because of this, the information...showing the employee's name and social security [number] ... is entitled to confidential protection...."

We note that if FPL used only a part of an employee's social security number as an internal identifying employee number, then this procedure would both protect the social security information and allow full public access to basic utility payroll records collected during a commission staff audit. However, the existing FPL payroll systems report employee social security numbers, and therefore, we recommend to grant a confidential classification, in accordance with Section 366.093(3)(f), Florida Statutes, to the reported social security numbers present in staff's audit workpapers.

Lastly to qualify for confidential classification, the information must be held as confidential and not publicly disclosed. FPL witnesses report the material has been held as confidential by FPL.

Confidential Classification Period

Section 366.093(4), Florida Statutes, limits the length of confidential protection to 18 months unless, for good cause shown, a longer protection period is appropriate. The utility has requested that employee social security numbers be protected for the entire time this information is retained by the Commission. The utility points out these social security numbers are confidential information and will remain valid for a long period of time. We recommend social security numbers be granted confidential protection until the social security information contained in documents 11948-98 and 12622-98 is destroyed or returned to FPL.

The utility has requested that customer account numbers also be protected for the entire time this information is retained by the Commission. The utility argues knowledge of a customer account number could allow unauthorized access to customer energy usage and demand information and could cause other harm. FPL customers have internet access to their account information through inputting their account number and a pin number at an FPL internet site. Because release of the customer account number could cause unauthorized access to customer information, we recommend that the Commission protect this information for a 10 year period. FPL has requested that customer account information be protected until the information is returned. Staff's recommendation for a 10 year protection period reflects that the customer could leave the FPL system or encryption techniques could improve. If either of these events occur, or if other events with a similar effect occur, prohibiting public access to FPL customer account numbers would no longer be necessary. Before any 10-year protection period ends, if the information is still sensitive, the utility may request an extension of the confidential classification period for good cause shown.

For material other than the employee social security number and the customer's account number, FPL has requested that the material be held a confidential for at least 18 months. The utility has also requested that this material be returned to FPL when the Commission no longer needs the information in accordance with the provisions of Section 366.093(4), F.S.

The Commission has recently responded to a utility's request for return of audit information classified as confidential in Commission Order PSC-98-1024-CFO-EG, dated July 28, 1998. The Prehearing Officer's order provided that since Commission audit working papers are retained by the Commission for a period of 25 years, this material which is confidential also needs to be retained by the Commission for that period. The Order went on to state; "if prior to the expiration of the [appropriate] confidential time period[s], FPL wishes to petition for continued confidential classification of this material, it may do so for good cause". We agree with a continuation of this policy, which would cause the materials in this case to be retained for 25 years and not returned to the utility prior to then.

A detailed recommendation follows identifying the period of confidential protection recommended for each document.

On July 20, 1999, when copies of certain portions of staff's working papers regarding FPL's Energy Conservation Cost Recovery Clause audit were delivered to the utility at the audit exit conference, the utility requested that these documents be temporarily excepted from public access in accordance with the provisions of Rule 25-22.006(3)(a)(2), Florida Administrative Code (FAC). On July 28, 1999, staff filed document 08857-99 consisting of those specified portions of the audit working papers. This document is currently held by the Division of Records and Reporting and designated as temporarily exempt from public access.

On August 5, 1999, the utility filed a request pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, FAC, and Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S.), that selected portions of the working papers prepared by staff during the audit receive confidential classification. The utility's request included highlighted copies (09354-99) and redacted copies (Exhibit B, Document 09353-99) for public use.

We note the utility's filing incorrectly referred to staff's audit report as pertaining to the "Environmental Cost Recovery Audit" No. 99-062-4-1. Confidential documents filed by the utility refer to staff's audit pertaining to the utility "Conservation Cost Recovery Audit" No. 99-062-4-1. We recommend this fact be reported in any order granting a confidential status for this material.

Pursuant to Section 119.07, F. S., documents submitted to this Commission are public records. The only exemptions to this law are specific statutory exemptions and exemptions granted by governmental agencies pursuant to the specific terms of a statutory provision. Subsections 366.093(3)(d) and (e), F.S., provide the following exceptions:

"Proprietary confidential business information means information, regardless of form or characteristics, which is owned or controlled by the person or company, is intended to be and is treated by the person or company as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to the ratepayers or the person's or company's business operations, and has not been disclosed unless disclosed pursuant to a statutory provision, an order of a court or administrative body, or private agreement that provides that the information will not be released to the public. Staff Analysis of FPL's Request

Analysis of the utility's request and listing of confidential materials reveals the sensitive information presented in the filing consists of:

1) Customer Names and Account Numbers of Non Governmental customers

According to FPL witnesses Cathy Carpenter, Supervisor - Power Billing Department, and Dennis Brandt, Manager of Sales and Marketing Support, customer names and account information is proprietary customer information, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of FPL or the provider of the information. The witnesses also report that FPL maintains the confidentiality of this information.

2) Information concerning bids or other contractual data

FPL witness Joaquin Leon, Senior Attorney - Law Department, asserts the material consists of materials, statements and data pertaining to ongoing litigation, the disclosure of which would tend to reveal FPL's litigation posture and strategy in ongoing proceedings.

Staff Recommendation

Based upon review of the sensitive materials presented in this filing, we recommend the materials be granted a confidential classification on the basis that the materials disclose sensitive contractual and competitive information the release of which would cause harm to the utility or the provider of the information.

To qualify for confidential classification, the information must be held as confidential and not publicly disclosed. FPL witnesses Carpenter, Brandt and Leon report the material has been held as confidential by FPL.

Confidential Classification Period

Section 366.093(4), Florida Statutes, limits the length of confidential protection to 18 months unless, for good cause shown, a longer protection period is appropriate.

FPL has requested that the material be held as confidential for at least 18 months. The utility has also requested that this material be returned to FPL when the Commission no longer needs the information in accordance with the provisions of Section 366.093(4), F.S.

The Commission has recently responded to a utility's request for return of audit information classified as confidential in Commission Order PSC-98-1024-CFO-EG, dated July 28, 1998. The Prehearing Officer's order provided that since Commission audit working papers are retained by the Commission, this material which is confidential also needs to be retained by the Commission for the same period. The Order went on to state; "if prior to the expiration of the confidential time period, FPL wishes to petition for continued confidential classification of this material, it may do so for good cause". Accordingly, we recommend that confidential protection for these materials be granted for 18 months, which would allow a request for an extension of this period, as the utility deems necessary.

A detailed recommendation, as found, follows identifying each document recommended for a confidential classification.
