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3 PROCEEDINGS 1 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: COMMISSIONER BAEZ: We are going 2 3 to call the status conference to order. 4 Counsel, can you read the notice, please. 5 MS. STERN: At the conclusion of the status conference that was held on July 13th, 2001, this time and 6 place were announced for the continuation of that status 7 conference in Docket 010827-EI. The status conference was 8 9 noticed in the FAW on July 6th. 2001. COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Thank you. And we will retake 10 appearances. Mr. Stone. 11 MR. STONE: I'm Jeffrey A. Stone with the law firm of 12 Beggs and Lane in Pensacola, representing Gulf Power Company. 13 14 MS. KAUFMAN: Good morning. Commissioner. Vicki 15 Gordon Kaufman from the McWhirter Reeves law firm. I'm here on 16 behalf of the Florida Industrial Power Users Group. 17 MR. HOWE: Roger Howe with the Public Counsel's Office. 18 19 MR. VANDIVER: Rob Vandiver with the Public Counsel's Office. 20 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Welcome all. As you heard, this 21 22 is a continuation of a status conference held on July 13th. 23 2001, and we are reconvening for purposes of evaluating our 24 status along the lines and trying to come up with a 25 determination as to whether the dates that were suggested at

1 the previous status conference are still viable, namely the 2 September 5th hearing date. And I guess, staff counsel, do you 3 want to give us staff's evaluation of how the progress has Come 4 about?

5 MS. STERN: Yes. Staff recommends that we go with 6 the hearing date on September 5th. We think that Gulf has been 7 very responsive in providing the information we need and we 8 have been able to get it very quickly. So assuming that things 9 continue this way, we think we can go with the hearing on 10 September 5th.

11 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Okay. Ms. Kaufman, do you have 12 any comments to add?

13 MS. KAUFMAN: Well, Commissioner, we are still 14 concerned, as we have been throughout the case, about the very expedited nature of how this process is going. We don't feel 15 that we have had sufficient time to prepare, so I would just 16 17 like those comments on the record. But we will do the best we 18 can if it is your decision to go to hearing on September 5th. COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Thank you, Ms. Kaufman. 19 20 Public Counsel.

MR. HOWE: We would echo Ms. Kaufman's sentiments.
We are also very concerned, in particular the way we are
viewing it right now if we are to file testimony, it is only
going to address the company's prefiled direct testimony.
COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Thank you, Mr. Howe. And I want

to tell you, I mean, as you both have registered your concerns,
I think that the Commission and the Staff has gone into this
with a relative level of concern, as well. This is not us
barrelling forward. But I think that we have got an
opportunity here that certainly the Commission thought
worthwhile to explore. And I think we share, at least to some
extent, your concerns, and let that be on the record, as well.

8 But we do recognize. at least this Commissioner 9 recognizes, that Gulf has made sufficient effort for the time 10 being in order to be responsive to staff's request and to try 11 and keep this moving. In the prehearing officer's opinion, I 12 think they have at least borne the burden of not delaying an 13 expedited time schedule. So they have at least in my -- they have met my expectations of allowing this to move forward as we 14 15 have decided.

16 So let the record show that we will set the hearing 17 officially for September 5th. Counsel, does anything have to 18 issue from this status conference -- any order has to issue 19 from this status conference in particular?

MS. STERN: Yes. We should do an order. The last order from the last status conference said that we were setting aside September 5th and September 19th, and that we would decide today which of those hearings dates. So we should issue an order saying we will go with the September 5th hearing date. COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Are there any other pending

1 ||matters?

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MR. STONE: Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Yes.

MR. STONE: With regard to the notice that will come out, we continue to be concerned about any delays beyond September 5th. And we, again, re-emphasize our desire and need for a bench decision. I just want to be sure that the notice that comes out at least provides for that opportunity for the Commission.

10 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: It is my understanding, and I 11 guess that is a guestion that I had, counsel, what is the -- I 12 know that Mr. Elias had said that Legal staff would at least 13 look into the matter. Because, as I recall, Mr. Vandiver's 14 suggestion was that the rules may not allow for a bench 15 decision. Now I don't know what the status of that research is 16 or what your opinion on that is, but I think we need to take 17 Mr. Stone's suggestion under advisement.

MS. STERN: Yes. Well, the notice will definitely say -- if we are going to have a bench decision, it should be in the notice. We have found nothing that precludes the Commission from making a bench decision in the uniform rules or the APA.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: So far so good then. Thank you,
Mr. Stone. Anything else?

MR. STONE: Just one other matter, Commissioner. And

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1 that is that the parties, Staff and Public Counsel have 2 requested the other supporting documents; the transfer and sale 3 agreement, the operating agreement and the interconnection agreement. We had not intended to develop those documents 4 before the approval of the PPA had been granted. But because 5 of the request of the parties to have an opportunity to review 6 7 those documents as part of this proceeding, we have moved the timetable up for those documents. 8

And I am pleased to report that we are able to file g those today. And that will be in response to sort of an 10 11 informal request from staff and a formal request of production from the Office of Public Counsel. We will be filing those 12 13 documents as attachments to 13 pages of supplemental direct 14 testimony from two witnesses which is intended to sponsor these 15 documents and also sponsor the confidential document that was 16 filed with the Commission back on June 29th.

17 I had already indicated in previous proceedings that 18 we intended to sponsor that as an exhibit to this proceeding. 19 And then, finally, yesterday we completed the second of two issue ID meetings. And I think we have come very close to 20 21 finalizing the list of issues, subject to some objections that 22 will be presented to you at the prehearing conference. And as 23 a result of those issues, that 13 pages of testimony addresses 24 any additional issues that were raised in the course of those 25 two issue ID sessions. And, again, we will have that

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testimony -- they are collocating it now. We finished it also 1 2 night, and they are collocating it now to give to the parties 3 and to staff and file with the clerk's office this morning. 4 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: The wheels turn as we speak. Mr. 5 Howe, you were propping up to say something. 6 MR. HOWE: Yes, Commissioner Baez. I would want to 7 say on the record that this is the first notice that I have 8 gotten that there is going to be supplemental direct testimony. 9 I thought we were faced with direct testimony that had been 10 prefiled. 11 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: And in your request for the 12 documents that Mr. Stone described, and forgive me, I heard 13 agreement in there somewhere, but can you clarify what they 14 are? 15 MR. STONE: Yes. It is the asset purchase and sale 16 agreement that will be executed by Southern Power and Gulf 17 Power once this whole process is approved, if it is approved; 18 the operating agreement under which Gulf will be operating 19 Smith Unit 3 for Southern Power: and the interconnection 20 agreement by which Smith Unit 3 will be interconnected with 21 Gulf's system. And there are some other significant documents 22 that are referenced in those documents that are also part of 23 this filing. 24 COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Mr. Howe, was it -- I'm sorry, was it your expectation that those documents will be produced 25

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1 without a sponsoring witness?

MR. HOWE: Well, discovery is just that. It is discovery. It is information that we are interested in that has not been provided. I'm not familiar with any case where discovery necessarily leads to the Respondent providing testimony on that discovery. What we seek in discovery is for our own purposes and our own reasons.

8 Commissioner Baez, I would remind you that the 9 company filed their petition, I believe, on June 8th.

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COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Yes.

11 MR. HOWE: We are close to two months into this 12 process that they want to expedite. And we are now being told 13 that we are going to see additional prefiled direct testimony, 14 and you have just announced we are going to go ahead with the 15 September 5th hearing. I think this an extreme constraint to 16 expect anybody to respond to reasonably.

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COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Thank you, Mr. Howe. Staff.

MS. STERN: I guess we would have to see. It could be an extreme constraint on the 9/5 hearing. It depends, in my mind, on the content of the supplemental direct testimony. Is it something that there is a lot of it and it's --

MR. STONE: As I have indicated, it is 13 pages
between two witnesses, and then it has the documents attached
to it. The bulk of it is the documents.

COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Mr. Howe, just a question. Are

1	you raising a formal objection to the filing of this			
2	supplemental testimony, or would you like to hold			
3	MR. HOWE: I would say at this point I am preserving			
4	an objection. This is something I have not seen.			
5	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: I agree. I mean, that is what I			
6	thought you were doing. Ms. Kaufman, you			
7	MS. KAUFMAN: Well, I would want to preserve my			
8	objection, too. As we said earlier, you know, this has been a			
9	very expedited process. We are scrambling just to find someone			
10	that can help us deal with what has already been filed. I			
11	realize 13 pages of testimony doesn't sound like much. We			
12	don't know what it will say, but certainly			
13	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: It sounds like a cover page			
14	almost.			
15	MS. KAUFMAN: Right. The documents will be, I			
16	imagine, voluminous and complicated. And I think it is beyond			
17	extraordinary to expect us I believe our rebuttal testimony			
18	is due in about two weeks, and that is just very difficult.			
19	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Now you are on the record. And I			
20	guess the suggestion here is let's wait to see what the			
21	supplemental testimony brings, and we will evaluate whether you			
22	all want to move on with more formal objections to it. Yes?			
23	MR. VANDIVER: At the appropriate time we would also			
24	like the opportunity to argue the merits of the bench decision			
25	and the appropriateness of the bench decision, be that at the			
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1 prehearing conference or otherwise.

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COMMISSIONER BAEZ: I was going to ask, I mean, is
that something that we can entertain at the prehearing
conference and that will give everyone time to prepare? I
think that is what we are going to do, Mr. Vandiver. Thank
you.

Is there anything else?

8 MR. STONE: The only other thing, Commissioner, and 9 it may not be pertinent to this conference, but I thought I 10 would bring it to your attention. The staff has asked for, as 11 they are entitled to, an opportunity to depose Gulf's 12 witnesses. And we are working with staff on finding a suitable 13 date. And we expect -- I wanted to let Ms. Stern know that she 14 had asked about our availability on the 15th, and we have 15 determined that our witnesses are available on the 15th.

We had previously announced to staff in response to a request for dates between August 6th and August 15 that our witnesses would be available on the 7th and 8th. Evidently those dates are not convenient for the staff, and so they asked for us to check on the 15th, and we have determined that those witnesses would be available on the 15th.

MS. STERN: That is true. We didn't ask specifically for the 15th. If the Gulf witnesses weren't available on the 7th or 8th, Gulf said the only time that they would be available, it seemed, was on the 15th and now that has been

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1	verified. We had staff members, key staff members, who				
2	wouldn't be available for the depositions at the earlier time.				
3	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: What are you saying? Are we okay				
4	with the 15th?				
5	MS. STERN: Yes, we are okay with the 15th.				
6	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Great. Progress. Thank you, Mr.				
7	Stone. Is there anything else?				
8	MR. STONE: None from us, Commissioner.				
9	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Ms. Kaufman? Mr. Vandiver?				
10	Staff, any other pending, anything else pending?				
11	MS. STERN: No.				
12	COMMISSIONER BAEZ: Not at this time. Great, we can				
13	go back and discuss when the order can issue. Great. Thank				
14	you everyone for coming. We are adjourned.
