AT&T COMMUNICATIONS OF THE SOUTHERN STATES, INC., TCG SOUTH FLORIDA, AND MEDIAONE FLORIDA TELECOMMUNICATIONS, INC.'S PROPOSED ISSUES

AT&T Communications of the Southern States ("AT&T"), TCG South Florida ("TCG"), and MediaOne Florida Telecommunications, Inc. ("MediaOne"), by and through undersigned counsel, and pursuant to the Memorandum issued by the Staff of the Florida Public Service Commission on January 10, 2002, in reference to the above captioned docket, hereby submit the following proposed issues for hearing and decision by the Commission in this proceeding:

- <u>Issue 13</u>: How should a "local calling area" be defined, for purposes of determining the applicability of reciprocal compensation?
- (A) Should the Commission establish a default definition of "local calling area" for the purpose of intercarrier compensation, to apply in the event parties cannot reach a negotiated agreement?
- (B) If so, should the default definition of local calling area for purposes of intercarrier compensation be: 1) LATA-wide local calling, 2) based upon the originating carrier's retail local calling area, or 3) some other default definition/mechanism?
- (C) If a local calling area is defined as LATAwide, should every call that originates on one party's network and terminates on another party's network within the same LATA, excluding ISP traffic, be treated as local traffic for reciprocal compensation purposes?
- Issue 17: Should the Commission establish compensation mechanisms governing the transport and delivery or termination of traffic subject to Section 251 of the Act to be used in the absence of the parties reaching agreement or

negotiating a compensation mechanism? If so, what should be the mechanism?

- (A) What is the potential financial impact, if any, of bill and keep arrangements and symmetrical reciprocal compensation arrangements for local exchange companies?
- (B) What potential advantages or disadvantages would result from the imposition of bill and keep arrangements and symmetrical reciprocal compensation arrangements as a default mechanism?
- (C) If the Commission imposes bill and keep as a default mechanism, will the Commission need to define generically "roughly balanced?" If so, how should the Commission define "roughly balanced?"
