### **Explanation of Proprietary Information**

- 1. The information requested contains vendor specific practices/procedures utilized by BellSouth to conduct business. This information, if released, would allow BellSouth's competitors to have free access to certain intellectual property that was developed at significant expense to BellSouth. BellSouth's competitors can use this information to develop their own strategies without the burden and expense of developing this property for themselves. Thus the disclosure of this information to BellSouth's competitors would impair BellSouth's ability to compete and the information is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes. In addition, this information, which BellSouth keeps as trade secrets, is valuable because BellSouth uses it in conducting its business. Release of this information would violate the agreement between BellSouth and its vendor. Therefore, this information should be classified as proprietary, confidential business information exempt from the Open Records Act.
