BellSouth also points to the UNEs that were ordered in March 2000 and in October 2000 as evidence that Supra can and has ordered UNEs; these arguments are red herrings. To top it all off, it is BellSouth's position that Supra is not entitled to order all UNE combos; however, when Supra inquired as to the recurring and nonrecurring charges for same on January 13, 2000 [Exhibit DN-38], BellSouth's Mr. Finlen informed Supra, on April 17, 2000, that these charges were in the Agreement, its attachments, and in its amendments [Exhibit DN-39], which he correctly does, considering that the FPSC had already ordered same in PSC-98-0810-FOF-TP. **Exhibit DN-40**. BellSouth seeks to have it both ways – when Supra requests additional pricing, BellSouth claims it already exists; but when Supra requests the ability to order, BellSouth claims that Supra needs more pricing.
