Me, again.

Wanted you to know I have verified that the Commission has received the utility's 2001 Annual Report and 2001 regulatory assessment fees (RAFs). The Commission has also received penalties and interest for prior year's underpayment of RAFs. So, with respect to these matters, the utility appears to be current with the Commission. The only remaining responsibility is payment of 2002 RAFs up to the date of the closing. Since the transfer will hopefully occur before 12/31/02, there will be no requirement for a 2002 annual report.

I also called Mr. Small. He said he will look for Certificate No. 413-W and will either send it to the Commission or a statement of his efforts to locate it. Also, Mr. Small said his wife mailed the property taxes about three weeks ago. If you call the County Assessor's office, you should be able to confirm payment.

Finally, I told Mr. Small that you were having a meeting tomorrow with your attorney. Mr. Small said he will be at his work number (519) 396-2658 all day tomorrow. I'd suggest that you call him from your attorney's office to discuss any final contract provisions. That should speed things up enormously.

Since the transfer will hopefully occur before 12/31/02, there will be no requirement for a 2002 annual report.



EXCERPTS OF MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING OF SILVER CITY OAKS INC. HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION OF JANUARY 29, 2002 OF INTEREST TO THE FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICES COMMISSION

Twenty-seven homeowners met in the picnic area. President Jeannine Campbell welcomed all the snowbirds back to their winter homes, as well as the permanent residents joining us this year.

WATER REPORT (prepared by Ross Prong) was read by Helen Prong. John Herr has offered to obtain specific paint for the necessary painting of the water tank. Request was made for volunteers for this time limited job, using epoxy paint.

MOTION. To set up an Emergency Fund of \$500.00 to cover road and water expenses incurred during the off season. Moved by Bob Kirkpatrick, Seconded by Phil Lebron. Carried.

NEW BUSINESS - Our water system was abandoned by David Small as of December 31, 2001. It is necessary for us to form a not-for-profit homeowners association in order for us to take over the operation of the water system. All necessary paperwork has been completed and forwarded to the Florida Department of State. As part of this process and after a simple majority vote of the homeowners, we are now officially known as Silver City Oaks Inc.

BY-LAWS - A sample of by-laws from a similar community in Florida are being considered to assist in forming our own set of By-laws.

It was suggested that all absent landowners be assessed a nominal yearly fee of \$25.00 to assist in general maintenance in our subdivision to enhance their properties and thereby increase the possibility of re-sale.

It was suggested that Liability Insurance be obtained to cover our water system.

Twenty one homeowners met in the park. President Jeannine Campbell thanked everybody for coming out.

Minutes of the January 29, 2002 Annual Meeting were read by Helen Prong and adopted by Pat Gervais, seconded by Fred Campbell.

Financial Report was read by Helen Prong indicating some residents were still delinquent with their 2002 membership fees. We have a balance of \$8,732.83.

Road Report was read by Ross Prong. He indicated some fill was needed on the intersection at 107th Terrace Rd/151st St. The curve here is too close to the water shut-off valve. A post installed at this location should correct the situation.

Report to Members (attached) was read by Jeannine Campbell.

MOTION: To take over the water system from the Small family. Moved by Helen Prong, seconded by Currie Long. Carried unanimously with all in favour and none against.

MOTION: To assess all absent vacant land owners an annual fee of \$25.00 for road and water maintenance. Moved by Bob Kirkpatrick, seconded by Pat Gervais. Approved by the majority present. This motion will be implemented in the fall of 2002.

MOTION: To reimburse Jeannine Campbell and Helen Prong for their traveling expenses for their trip to Palatka. Moved by Mike Kilkenny, seconded by Judith Chamberlaine. Carried.

Judith Chamberlain thanked the executive for their engoing efforts involved in the takeover of the water system. This was followed by a round of applause by all present and a 'you're welcome' from the executive.

Since there was no new business, a motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Ada Perkins, seconded by Fred Campbell.

Two Executive meetings were held in February with all members present

Feb. 7 – to approve letters sent to homeowners re the increase in our annual fees to \$125.00; and

to request past due arrears for 2001 of \$100.00 plus current dues of \$125.00 for those who did not pay their dues last year:

to peruse the sample By-laws received from Pat Brady and prepare proposed By-laws for our association,

to discuss procedures to follow in the event of a water line leak – instructions to be posted in the pump house. Tools for repairs should be stored in the pump house and water shut-off valves to be located around the subdivision and identified.

Feb 25 – called to prepare questions for meeting with our lawyer on Feb 26.

discussed letter to be sent to landowners if approved at the general meeting in March

discussed letter prepared by Terry Devine to John Dykes re the abandoned trailers

discussed continued efforts re Consumptive Use Permit

On February 26 Bob Kirkpatrick, Helen Prong and I went to the office of Gordon Engineering to obtain blueprints and specs of our water system. Helen made copies for our files and for St. John's River Water Mgmnt. District.

On February 26, the entire Executive met with our lawyer Lewis Dinkins. Some of his suggestions are:

\$1,000,000.00 liability insurance be purchased.

— If we have reasonable by-laws, we are not responsible for accidents on our public roads. Homeowners' personal liability insurance will protect against private property claims.

A visit to Code Enforcement of Marion County is all that is required to deal with unsightly waste, abandoned trailers, or any other "nuisance" in the subdivision

The water should be tested on the day of change of ownership of the water system

We are advised to pay any outstanding taxes on that part of the Small property in which we are interested. Helen Prong and I went to the Tax office on March 1 and were advised that all outstanding taxes for the year 2000 were paid on February 28, 2002, leaving the previous Tax Certificate null and void.

Mr. Dinkins said it is not compulsory for everyone to join our association, but that anyone who does not is to be charged a reasonable rate for their water consumption. He advised us to admit only those people who intend to abide by the reasonable rules of our association.

The proposed by-laws were left with Mr. Dinkins for his perusal

Consumptive Use Permit – On March 6 we received an e-mail from David Small authorizing Helen Prong and I to act as Small's agents to obtain a Consumptive Use Permit. On March 8 Helen, Ross and I attended a meeting in Palatka with Randy Motes of St. John's River Management who helped us to complete part of this lengthy report. Some of the report required information contained in the monthly reports we receive from Aqua Pure so Helen and I spent most of Saturday perusing these reports for the past 4 years to come up with the required numbers. Mr. Motes told us that we are expected to do whatever it takes to conserve our water by following county water use rules, etc. etc. so that we can continue as we are now without being forced to go to meters. St. John's are to get copies of our reports from Aqua Pure so they can be made aware of our daily water consumption. Again, on March 14, we went to Palatka to give Mr. Motes of St. Johns River Water Management District our completed C.U.P. application and paid the \$200.00 fee. Mr. Motes said the application looked just fine: he gave us a Permit No. (82743) and said we should receive our Permit within 4 to 6 weeks.

Later that day we received from Pat Brady of Florida Public Services Commission an Application for Transfer of the water system from Small to the association which needs to be completed and perused by our lawyer. We hope to meet with him soon.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS

SILVER CITY OAKS INC. P.O. Box 676, Ft. McCoy, Fl. 32134-0676

ARTICLE 1

NAME

The name of this Association shall be Silver City Oaks Inc. a not for profit corporation duly organized and incorporated under the laws of the State of Florida.

ARTICLE 2

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Association shall be for the negotiating, acquiring and operating of the water system currently in operation.

ARTICLE 3

MEMBERSHIP

Any adult person and his/her spouse owning a lot in the Silver City Oaks Inc. subdivision shall be a member and shall be entitled to one vote, with a limit of two votes per family, as long as they are in good standing with all fees and assessments paid.

ARTICLE 4

OFFICERS

The Executive officers shall be: President, Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. These officers shall serve without compensation and at the pleasure of the association members.

The Board of Directors shall consist of the executive members and the immediate Past President for a total of six (6) members.

ARTICLE 5

TERM OF OFFICERS

The Executive Officers shall be elected for a two-year term, but may be elected for additional terms.

The immediate Past President shall serve a two-year term on the Board of Directors immediately following the end of his/her term as President.

If a vacancy occurs, the Board of Directors shall fill the vacancy.

Any member of the Board of Directors may be recalled and removed from office with cause by vote of the majority of association members.

ARTICLE 6

MEETINGS

An Annual Meeting will be held in late January or early February each year. A General Meeting will be held in mid-March each year. Written notice of such meetings will be displayed in a conspicuous place on the bulletin board in the park at least one week (7 days) prior to the meeting.

An Agenda of said meeting will be displayed in a conspicuous place on the bulleting board in the park at least three (3) days prior to the meeting.

Executive Meetings will be held, as required.

Special Meetings may be held at the call of the President or by a majority of the Board of Directors.

All meetings shall be conducted by Robert's Rules of Order.

Minutes of all meetings shall be made and kept in a business-like manner and filed in a safe place and retained for not less than seven (7) years.

ARTICLE 7

MANAGING AND OPERATING

Annual Dues are due by January 31 each year and payable to Silver City Oaks Inc. and sent or given to the Treasurer who will issue a receipt for same.

Annual Dues will be reviewed at the Annual Meeting each year and revised, if necessary.

Non-payment of dues will result in action as specified by legal counsel.

ARTICLE 8

MOTIONS

Any Motion which effects the policies or by-laws of the association must be presented in writing to the Board of Directors before being proposed at a meeting.

ARTICLE 9

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

All nominees must have expressed their willingness to serve before their names may be presented to the association members for election. The elected officer shall assume the duties of his/her office immediately following installation at the annual meeting.

ARTICLE 10

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- 1 The President shall preside at all meetings of the association.
- 2 The Vice-President shall assume the duties of the President during his/her absence and fulfill other duties as requested by the President or Board of Directors.
- 3 The Second Vice-President shall take charge of the duties described in 1 and 2 if both the President and Vice-President are absent.
- 4 The Secretary shall keep business-like Minutes of each meeting and shall read such Minutes at the next meeting. The Secretary shall receive and file all correspondence and records of the association.
- The Treasurer shall receive and deposit all monies into the bank account of the association and pay out all necessary accounts approved by the Board of Directors. Correct and accurate accounting of all money received, deposited and spent shall be recorded. An audited detailed financial report shall be read at the Annual Meeting, copies of which will be distributed to all members in good standing present at the meeting.
- 6 An annual inventory of the physical assets of the association shall be reported at the Annual Meeting.
- 7 The Emergency Fund of \$500.00 to cover road and water expenses incurred during the summer months shall be reviewed by the Board of Directors and presented to the members at the Annual Meeting.
- The President, Secretary and Treasurer shall keep an orderly file of all documents and correspondence that pertain to the operation and well being of the association. At the termination of their offices they shall pass on all said files to their successors.

ARTICLE 11

GENERAL PARK RULES

- 1 Property owners shall be responsible for the behavior of their guests and/or occupants and shall be liable for any damages.
- 2 No discharging of firearms or bows and arrows shall be allowed within the confines of Silver City Oaks Inc.
- 3 Accumulation of derelict motor vehicles, discarded items shall be prohibited from all properties.
- 4 All buildings will be kept in a well maintained condition and appearance.

ARTICLE 12

AMENDMENTS OF BY-LAWS

- 1 These By-laws may be amended or revised at a general meeting of the members of the association by a simple majority of the qualified members present, in good standing with all dues and fees paid, provided the proposed amendment or revision is submitted in writing at a regular business meeting prior to the voting.
- 2 The complete By-laws shall be reviewed at least every three years by the current executive and a report shall be given to the association members.
- When a property is to be sold, any and all prospective buyers are to be advised of the By-laws of the association by the seller and/or real estate sales person.
- 4 No By-law shall be amended by reference to its title or number only.
