Petitioner, City of Bartow, by and through its undersigned attorneys and pursuant to Florida Rule of Civil Procedure 1.560, hereby propounds the following interrogatories to Respondent, Tampa Electric Company ("TECO"), and demands answers to the interrogatories, in writing and under oath, within 20 days of service.

Instructions

- A. All information is to be divulged that is in the possession of the Plaintiff, its attorneys, investigators, agents, employees, or other representatives.
- B. Where an individual interrogatory calls for an answer that involves more than one part, each part of the answer should be clearly set out so that it is understandable.
 - C. In answering each interrogatory, identify each writing:
 - 1. Relied upon in the preparation of each answer, or
 - 2. Which forms all or part of the basis for the answer, or
 - 3. Which corroborates the answer, or
 - 4. The substance of which forms all or part of the answer.
- B. If all the information furnished in answer to all or any part of an interrogatory is not within the personal knowledge of the affiant, state the name of each person to whom all or any

part of the information furnished is a matter of personal knowledge and the name of each person who communicated to the affiant any part of the information furnished.

- C. If the answer to all or any part of the interrogatory is not presently known or available, include a statement to that effect.
- D. In the event that an interrogatory seeks information that is claimed to be privileged, the party answering these interrogatories should respond to as much of the interrogatory as is possible without violating the privilege, then state the privilege claimed and the basis therefore.

Definitions

As used herein:

- A. The terms "you," "your," "Tampa Electric Company," or "TECO" mean Respondent, Tampa Electric Company, its agents, representatives, employees, offers, and all other persons acting in or on its behalf.
- B. The term "OFP" as used herein refers to the Old Florida Plantation Development located in Polk County, Florida.

 - (b) To state its present location and custodian, and
 - (c) Either to state the substance thereof or to annex to and incorporate in the answers to these interrogatories a true and correct copy thereof.
