Pursuant to Staff's Memorandum dated August 15, 2002, scheduling an informal issue identification meeting on September 12, 2002, AT&T hereby provides its proposed list of issues in the above-referenced docket.

AT&T generally supports Staff's Preliminary List of Issues to be addressed at the issue identification meeting. In addition, AT&T adds the following issues and supplements Staff's Issues 7 and 12, as follows:


- New Issue: Should the standard interval for construction and provisioning decrease from 90 to 60 days?

- New Issue: Should an ILEC be allowed to charge an ALEC for upgrades to and construction of DC power plants in both the nonrecurring charge for space preparation and in the monthly recurring charge for DC power?


- ISSUE 7: Should an ILEC's per ampere (amp) rate for the provisioning of DC power to an ALEC's collocation space apply to amps used or fused capacity?
Add: If so, how should the charge for AC power be calculated?

ISSUE 12 For which collocation elements should rates be set? *Add: For those collocation elements for which rates should be set, what is the appropriate rate and what is the proper application of those rates?*
