REVISED PRELIMINARY LIST OF ISSUES OF CALPINE CORPORATION AND MIRANT AMERICAS DEVELOPMENT INC.

Come now, Calpine Corporation (Calpine) and Mirant Americas Development, Inc. (Mirant) and pursuant to Staff Memorandum dated September 23, 2002, hereby file their Revised Preliminary List of Issues in this proceeding. The revised preliminary issues are:

- ISSUE 1: Should the Commission approve the GridFlorida Companies' request for congestion management and energy markets that are based on financial rights and locational marginal pricing?
- ISSUE 2: Should the Commission approve the GridFlorida Companies' request for unbalanced schedules and a two settlement system with a voluntary day-ahead market and a real time market?
- ISSUE 3: Should the Commission approve the GridFlorida Companies' request for market clearing prices for balancing energy and congestion management?
- ISSUE 4: Should the GridFlorida proposal include an ICE specification to ensure the development of rational installed capacity markets with an appropriate transition mechanism?
- ISSUE 5: How should the transmission rights or congestion hedges for existing load and load growth be distributed among market participants?
- ISSUE 6: What market power mitigation measures should be included in the GridFlorida proposal and should they address localized market power as well as the lack of price-responsive demand?
- ISSUE 7: What is the appropriate mitigation mechanism for cost shifts associated with short-term transmission wheeling revenues?
- ISSUE 8: Should the GridFlorida OATT specifically require that CBM be taken into account in the calculation of ATC?
- ISSUE 9: Does JEA sell its CBM at market-based rates?

- ISSUE 10: Can JEA withhold transmission capability in real time or day ahead?
- ISSUE 10.A.: If the answer to Issue 10 is yes, can such authority compromise the efficiency of the GridFlorida market or create the potential for JEA to inappropriately affect the market price of energy inside Florida?
- ISSUE 11: Will the cost of network facilities which make JEA's CBM possible be subsidized by the ratepayers of Florida?
- ISSUE 12: Does JEA's CBM reservation reduce the access to competitively priced generation ratepayers could otherwise receive from the Southeast?
- ISSUE 13: Can JEA's ability to withhold limited intertie capability and control the price and timing of release of such capability be used by it to manipulate market prices in Florida or the cost to access generation outside of Florida?
- ISSUE 14: Was the original language of Attachment T of the OATT setting the December 15, 2000 demarcation date for existing transmission agreements appropriate?
- ISSUE 15: Does the denial of GridFlorida Applicants' modification of the December 15, 2000 demarcation date for existing transmission agreements preserve the anticipated cost and revenue recovery expected by all stakeholders as contemplated by the GridFlorida Applicants' FERC filings in Docket No. RTO1-67?
- ISSUE 16: Has the FERC already approved the December 15, 2000 conversion date?
- ISSUE 17: Will the hierarchical system operation result in market participants having control of existing communication infrastructure supporting existing local control area operation and have access to confidential market information?
- ISSUE 18: Under the proposed hierarchical control system, will transmission owners possess real-time dispatch authority over all or part of the transmission system for which GridFlorida will also have system operation responsibility?
- ISSUE 18.A. If the answer to Issue 18 is yes, what impact will the existence of multiple authorities have on the independence of system operation, the ability of the GridFlorida Companies to exert influence over locational energy clearing price outcomes, or the efficiency or reliability of the system operation?
- ISSUE 19: Does the GridFlorida proposal allow market participants to possess short-term dispatch authority, other than real time dispatch, over all or a part of the GridFlorida transmission system?
- ISSUE 19A. If the answer to Issue 19 is yes, which market participants are proposed to possess

dispatch authority and what impact will this have on independent system operation, reliability and efficiency?

- ISSUE 20: Do the GridFlorida Companies propose to exclude some wholesale transmission or generation facilities within Florida from the operational control of the GridFlorida ISO? If so, are any generating facilities proposed to be excluded from GridFlorida real-time dispatch and what entities will control excluded facilities?
- ISSUE 20A: If the answer to Issue 20 is yes, what impact will the exclusion of facilities have on independent system operation, reliability and efficiency?
