NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER GRANTING CANCELLATION OF ALTERNATIVE LOCAL EXCHANGE TELEPHONE (ALEC) AND INTEREXCHANGE TELEPHONE (IXC) CERTIFICATE DUE TO CHAPTER 11 BANKRUPTCY

BY THE COMMISSION:

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

Advanced TelCom of Delaware Inc. (Advanced) currently holds Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity Nos. 7436 (IXC) and 7437 (ALEC), issued by the Commission on May 30, 2000, authorizing the provision of Alternative Local Exchange Telephone (ALEC) and Interexchange Telephone (IXC) services.

Pursuant to Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, certificate holders must pay a minimum annual RAF of \$50 if the certificate was active during any portion of the calendar year. Pursuant to Rule

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25-4.0161(2), Florida Administrative Code, the form and applicable fees are due to the Florida Public Service Commission by January 30 of the subsequent year. All entities that apply for certification receive a copy of our rules governing Alternative Local Exchange Telephone (ALEC) and Interexchange Telephone (IXC) services.

We received notice that this company had filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection. In addition, we received a letter from the company requesting cancellation of its certificates and asking that any upaid Regulatory Assessment Fees be written off as no funds exist.

Chapter 11 of Section 109 of the Federal Bankruptcy Code provides for reorganization by business entities. The filing of a bankruptcy petition under Chapter 11 invokes an automatic injunction known as the Automatic Stay, codified in Bankruptcy Code Section 362. Section 362(b)(5) provides that, for governments, the filing of the petition does not operate as a stay "of the enforcement of a judgment, other than a money judgment, obtained in an actual proceeding by a governmental unit to enforce such governmental unit's police or regulatory power." (emphasis added) Thus, it would appear that we are not enjoined from exercising our police powers to protect public health, safety and welfare, but are enjoined from exercising our regulatory authority seeking to collect a debt. However, in this case, the company has requested cancellation of its certificates. Under those circumstances, this We note that the Division of the Commission is free to do so. Commission Clerk and Administrative Services will be notified that the past due RAFs should not be sent to the Comptroller's Office for collection, but that permission for the Commission to write-off the uncollectible amounts should be requested.

Accordingly, we find it appropriate to cancel Alternative Local Exchange Telephone (ALEC) and Interexchange Telephone (IXC) Certificate Nos. 7436 (IXC) and 7437 (ALEC), effective September 9, 2002. If Advanced's certificates are canceled in accordance with this Order, Advanced shall immediately cease and desist providing Alternative Local Exchange Telephone (ALEC) and Interexchange Telephone (IXC) services in Florida. We are vested with jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Sections 364.336, 364.285, and 364.335, Florida Statutes.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Advanced TelCom of Delaware Inc.'s Certificate Nos. 7436 (IXC) and 7437 (ALEC) to provide Alternative Local Exchange (ALEC) and Interexchange Telephone (IXC) services are hereby canceled, effective September 9,2002. It is further

ORDERED that the outstanding Regulatory Assessment Fees should not be sent to the Comptroller's Office for collection. The Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, instead, shall request for permission to write-off the uncollectible amounts. It is further

ORDERED that if Advanced TelCom of Delaware Inc.'s Certificate Nos. 7436 (IXC) and 7437 (ALEC) are canceled in accordance with this Order, that entity shall immediately cease and desist providing Alternative Local Exchange (ALEC) and Interexchange Telephone (IXC) services in Florida. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, this docket shall be closed.

In the absence of such a petition, this order shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order.

Any objection or protest filed in this/these docket(s) before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.
