This letter is in response to your letters dated January 25, and February 10, 2001, to Chairman Jacobs regarding the above-noted applications of Aloha Utilities, Inc. (Aloha or utility). Because these are pending cases, it would be improper for the Chairman to comment upon them. Therefore, the Chairman's Office forwarded your letters to the Division of Legal Services for response.

In your January 25, 2001 letter, you question a \$1.11 per thousand gallons water rate increase. The only increases authorized by Order No. PSC-01-0326-FOF-SU, issued February 6, 2001, in Docket No. 991643-SU, were for: (1) increased wastewater rates (increased gallonage charge for wastewater by \$1.09 per one thousand gallons with a ten-thousand gallon maximum per month, and increased the base facility charge for wastewater from \$8.99 to \$13.99); (2) increased reuse rates (increased from \$.25 per 1,000 gallons to \$.29 per 1,000 gallons); and (3) increased service availability charges (increased wastewater service availability charges from \$206.75 per equivalent residential connection (ERC) to \$1,650 per residential ERC). No increases for water rates were authorized in Order No. PSC-01-0326-FOF-SU.

However, the wastewater part of your utility bill will now consist of a \$13.99 base facility charge (a \$5 increase), and a gallonage charge of \$3.41 per 1,000 gallons (a \$1.09 increase per 1,000

gallons), based on your water consumption up to a maximum of 10,000 gallons per month. Therefore, if you were to use 5,000 gallons of water, your wastewater bill would be the \$13.99 base facility charge plus five times the gallonage charge of \$3.41 (\$13.99 fixed charge plus \$17.05 usage charge). This latter amount of \$17.05 is not a water bill, but the variable portion of your wastewater bill based on the estimate that an average residential consumer will return 80 percent of its water consumption through the wastewater system. The currently approved water rate is a \$7.17 base facility charge (includes 3,000 gallons), with a charge of \$1.28 per one thousand gallons over the three thousand gallons included. This water rate was not changed in Docket No. 991643-SU.

As for the change in wastewater rates, the Commission found, after an evidentiary hearing, that the increase in wastewater rates was warranted due to improvements required by the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP). Section 367.081, Florida Statutes, requires this Commission to approve rates which will give the utility an opportunity to earn a fair rate of return on its investment required by DEP. In this wastewater rate case, the utility requested an increase of 57.29%, and the Commission determined that a 49.49% increase was warranted.

In your February 10, 2001 letter, you refer to two new dockets - Dockets Nos. 010168-WU and 010156-WU. These dockets were opened when Aloha filed, respectively, a limited proceeding for increased water rates and a proceeding for increased water service availability charges. The latter filing was required by the Commission in Order No. PSC-00-1285-FOF-WS, issued July 14, 2000, in Docket No. 960545-WS.

As you state, in Docket No. 010156-WU, Aloha is asking for increased "Impact Fees," i.e., what the Commission calls "service availability charges." In Docket No. 960545-WS, the Commission noted that Aloha had very low impact fees and directed Aloha to file a water service availability case by February 1, 2001. The objective of this water service availability case is to assure that future customers pay their fair share for the cost of growth. Therefore, Docket No. 010156-WU should benefit you and the other current customers.

As for Docket No. 010168-WU, Aloha is asking for increased water rates from its Seven Springs customers to recognize the increased costs that it will incur for having to purchase water from Pasco County. You argue that these increased costs are the result of poor management and Aloha's failure to plan ahead. That is exactly what the staff and the Commission will investigate in determining whether an increase in water rates is warranted. Only those expenses that are found to be prudent will be allowed by the Commission. If the Commission determines that the utility could have avoided some or all of these increased costs through proper management, then it will not allow those costs which it deems to be imprudent.

Pending the determination of the appropriate final water rates, the utility has requested an emergency, temporary increase in water rates. If the Commission does approve emergency, temporary rates, then they will be subject to refund and protected by an appropriate security. Also, prior to final water rates being set, the Commission will give the customers and/or the Office of

Public Counsel an opportunity to request a hearing. As always, if a hearing is scheduled, the hearing will be in the New Port Richey area, and the customers will have the opportunity to testify.

Dear Sirs:

I write this letter out of sheer frustration because of a billing situation with Aloha Utilities, Inc., the company which supplies water and sewer service to my home in Aloha Gardens, Holiday.

I have lived at 3519 Jackson Drive in Holiday, Florida, for more than 25 years. During that time period, my water usage has never exceeded 3,000 gallons per month, even during times when I entertained visitors in my home. I have always taken great pains to conserve water. I never watered my gardens or lawns, or washed my cars with public water. I collected water in rainbarrels for those purposes. My husband and I always had a great respect for this valuable resource.

Last November, I decided to visit my family for an extended period of time. Before I left, I went to the office of Aloha Utilities and explained that I was going away on vacation for approximately two months, but I did not want to leave any unpaid water bills during the time I was away. I left a deposit of \$100.00 to be used for any bills which would be issued during my vacation.

Upon my return on January 3, 2001, I received a water bill for the period November 25 through December 22, 2000, showing water usage of 52,250 gallons of water. You can imagine my disbelief. I immediately went to Aloha Utilities to get some answers, and I took my billing history with me to be reviewed. The person with whom I spoke would not listen to anything I had to say. She simply stated that there must have been a leak, because the meter could not be incorrect. Therefore, someone must have used the water, or there was a leak under my house. You have to admit, a leak of some 50,000 gallons of water would have left an awfully large puddle as evidence somewhere. Incidentally, before I left, I turned the water off at the main shutoff valve.

After visiting the utility, I decided to check their "leak" theory. I ran the water in my home, and checked the meter as it was running. I turned the water off and checked the meter, and it did not advance with the faucets turned off. Still no answers, other than "then someone must have stolen your water" from Aloha Utilities.

I wrote the Utility a detailed letter, including my billing history for the past year, a copy of which is enclosed. I received a response, stating that they would do a flow test of the meter, and report the findings. After approximately 3 weeks, I received another phone call stating that the meter was running properly, but that I could request a "bench" test of the meter, at a cost to me of yet another \$20.00. I have not yet made the decision to "throw good money after bad," because I have a sneaky suspicion that their bench test will also reveal that nothing is wrong with the meter.

I know that I am not the only consumer who has had this same problem with Aloha Utilities. One of my neighbors experienced the exact same problem when she returned from a visit north. She received a water bill for an outrageous amount of water usage, with no apparent leaks. I have also read various letters to the editors of our local papers complaining of similar problems with Aloha Utilities.

I believe that something should be done to look into this matter. I personally am on a fixed income, and receive only my social security benefits. I paid the outrageous bill to avoid having my water turned off for nonpayment, but the additional \$200 outlay seriously affected my cash flow for the first three months of this year.

I would appreciate your investigation of this situation and the utility's billing practices. Thank you very much for your attention to this matter.



Dear Sir or Madam:

I am writing this letter on behalf of my Mother, Betty Prishvalko. My Mother advises me that she has received and paid a water billfor the period 11/25/00 through 12/22/00 in the amount of \$229.44. The bill indicated that she had used 52,250 gallons of water during that period. She has resided in her home for almost 30 yers, and her average water usage has been 2,500 gallons per month for the entire time. Copies of some of her more recent bills are enclosed for your convenience.

My Mother was visiting with me from November 20 through January 3, 2001. During the time she was away from her home in Holiday, the water in her house was turned off at the main shutoff valve. Before she left for vacation, she came to your office and left a \$100.00 deposit to be applied to any bills which would become due during the time she was away.

When she received the bill in question, my Mother tells me that she immediately came to your office for an explanation, and brought her past bills showing her usage for the year 2000. She tried to explain the problem to your



representative, and asked that her water use history be reviewed to determine where the error could have been made. She was very rudely told that the meter reading was correct, and there was nothing anyone could do to help her. She was told that she must have a leak somewhere.

I'm sure you will agree that a 52,250 gallon leak would leave some evidence somewhere in a one month period. My Mother found no indication of any leaks anywhere in her house, or outside of the house. In addition, she has been monitoring the meter since she returned home. The meter reading only advances when the water is turned on somewhere in the house. Therefore, the only conclusion is that there is no leak, and that the meter is defective.

My Mother has paid the amount billed to her to avoid having her water turned off for nonpayment. However, we respectfully request an immediate review of her account, replacement of the obviously defective water meter, and a refund of the overpayment for the error.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Dear Customer:

As mentioned in our last newsletter, Pasco County is still experiencing severe drought conditions. The irrigation schedule has been reduced to once a day, either before 9:00 a.m. or after 5:00 p.m., on your designated watering day. Refer to the chart below to determine what is your designated watering day:

0 or 1	Monday		
2 or 3	Tuesday

We have recently received approval from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) to provide reuse water in the Seven Springs service area. This will enable us to provide reclaimed water for irrigation to customers at a much lower price than they are now paying for potable water. We will be looking for input from our various Homeowner Associations to determine the desirability of providing reuse water to customer's homes. The availability of reuse to your area will be based upon your location and customer demand. If you are interested in receiving reuse for irrigation please state your request in writing to our office.

For your convenience, we will be installing a payment drop box in our parking lot for payment drop off. Look for it as you exit the parking lot at the end of the island.

The Florida Public Service Commission (FPSC) issued a final order approving an increase in rates for the Seven Springs Wastewater System on February 6, 2001. Representative Fasano stated in the press that he planned to protest the FPSC decision even before it was released. The Office of Public Counsel, apparently at Mr. Fasano's urging, has requested reconsideration of that order. We have now begun the process of preparing a response to deal with the request and are incurring costs that will ultimately increase your rates. Mr. Fasano has written that he believes the cost of reconsideration and appeal of an order was exaggerated in our last newsletter. However, Mr. Fasano has been informed by the FPSC that this is a feasible number. At the present time, since a request for reconsideration has been filed, the final rates cannot be implemented. Due to the request, you will continue to pay approximately a 6% higher rate than approved by the FPSC in the final order until this matter is resolved. This process will potentially take many months and cost thousands of additional dollars. The higher rate, or one even higher than originally requested, may well result once costs of responding to this reconsideration request and any possible appeal actions are added on.

We will continue to update you on various issues that affect your water and/or wastewater service. As always, we value your business and appreciate the opportunity to serve you.
