REISSUANCE OF NOTICE OF PROPOSED AGENCY ACTION ORDER IMPOSING PENALTY AND REQUIRING PAYMENT OF DELINQUENT REGULATORY ASSESSMENT FEES, OR CANCELING PAY TELEPHONE COMPANY CERTIFICATE

BY THE COMMISSION:

This is a reissuance of Order No. PSC-03-1072-PAA-TC, because due to a clerical oversight, the Order was initially issued prior to Commission vote. The order is therefore being reissued post-Commission vote.

NOTICE is hereby given by the Florida Public Service Commission that the action discussed herein is preliminary in nature and will become final unless a person whose interests are substantially affected files a petition for a formal proceeding, pursuant to Rule 25-22.029, Florida Administrative Code.

The following pay telephone service providers have not paid their 2002 Regulatory Assessment Fees, plus statutory penalty and interest charges, in compliance with Rule 25-4.0161, Florida Administrative Code, Regulatory Assessment Fees; Telecommunications Companies.

In addition, each of the companies listed has had returned mail and has not updated the information within 10 days of the change of its respective address (including street name and address, post office box, city), telephone number and any change in the name and address of the individual who is serving as primary liaison with the Commission. Our staff attempted to call each company, but was unsuccessful.

Therefore, it appears the companies listed above have failed to comply with Rules 25-4.0161, Florida Administrative Code, Regulatory Assessment Fees; Telecommunications Companies, and 25-24.520, Florida Administrative Code, Reporting Requirements, which are incorporated by Rule 25-24.505, Florida Administrative Code, requested cancellation of have not their respective certificates in compliance with Rule 25-24.514. Administrative Code.

Accordingly, we find it appropriate to assess a total penalty of \$1,000 (\$500 for the RAFs violation and \$500 for the Reporting Requirements violation) or cancel each company's respective certificate for apparent violation of Rule 25-4.0161, Florida Administrative Code, if the penalty, Regulatory Assessment Fees, including statutory penalty and interest charges, and the information required by Rule 25-24.520, Florida Administrative Code, are not received by the Commission within fourteen (14) calendar days after the issuance of the Consummating Order.

The total penalty of \$1,000 should be paid to the Florida Public Service Commission. If a company does not protest this Order or the penalty and Regulatory Assessment Fees, including statutory penalty and interest charges, and required information are not received, that company's certificate shall be cancelled administratively and the collection of the past due fees shall be referred to the Florida Department of Financial Services for further collection efforts. If a company's certificate is

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cancelled in accordance with this Order, the respective company should be required to immediately cease and desist providing pay telephone services in Florida.

We are vested with jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Sections 364.336, 364.285, 364.3375, and 364.183, Florida Statutes. Pursuant to Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, cancellation of an entity's certificate does not relieve the obligation to pay Regulatory Assessment Fees, including statutory penalty and interest charges, if the certificate was active during any portion of the calendar year including the year of cancellation.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that each of the entities listed herein shall pay the past due Regulatory Assessment Fees, statutory penalties, interest charges, and a \$1000 penalty to the Florida Public Service Commission for failure to comply with Section 364.336, Florida Statutes, and Rules 25-4.0161, and 25-24.520, incorporated by Rule 25-24.505, Florida Administrative Code, within 14 days after the issuance of the Consummating Order. The penalties will be referred to the Florida Department of Financial Services for deposit in the State of Florida General Revenue Fund. It is further

ORDERED that should any of the entities fail to comply with this Order, that entity's certificate shall be canceled, effective on the date of issuance of the Consummating Order; the collection of the past due fees shall be referred to the Florida Department of Financial Services for further collection efforts; and the respective docket shall be closed. It is further

ORDERED that if an entity's certificate is canceled in accordance with this Order, that entity shall immediately cease and desist providing competitive local exchange telecommunications services in Florida. It is further

ORDERED that any protest to the action proposed herein shall specify the entity or entities to which it applies. It is further

ORDERED that, if a protest to this Order is filed, the protest shall not prevent the action proposed herein from becoming final

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with regard to the remaining entities listed in this Order. It is further

ORDERED that the provisions of this Order, issued as proposed agency action, shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order unless an appropriate petition, in the form provided by Rule 28-106.201, Florida Administrative Code, is received by the Director, Division of the Commission Clerk and Administrative Services, 2540 Shumard Oak Boulevard, Tallahassee, Florida 32399-0850, by the close of business on the date set forth in the "Notice of Further Proceedings" attached hereto. It is further

ORDERED that in the event this Order becomes final, each docket shall be closed upon payment of the penalty, and fees, or upon cancellation of the certificate.
