CoreTel Florida will obtain use of facilities needed to provide services by leasing switching and transmission equipment from its sister affiliate company, CoreTel America, Inc., which will be responsible for leasing space and installing equipment at one or more wire center locations in Florida. CoreTel America currently owns and operates approximately 18 wire centers and other points of presence in Maryland, New York, Pennsylvania, and Virginia. CoreTel Florida will obtain minimal start up financing from its parent company, CoreTel Communications, Inc., which owns CLEC affiliates licensed in all of the same states where CoreTel America has network facilities. Almost immediately after commencement of its service offering, CoreTel Florida expects to be financially self-sufficient and self-financed.


