Pursuant to our conversation on January 7, 2005, your application for transfer of majority organizational control of L.W.V. Utilities, Inc. holder of Certificate No. 152-W in Pasco County is incomplete. You have been notified of the deficiencies in your application and the need for additional information through several letters and telephone conversations. You were last notified by a deficiency letter dated October 29, 2004 which had a response deadline of November 30, 2004. I have attached a copy of the deficiency letter which still needs to be addressed.

In addition, staff needs a description of the territory that prescribes to Rule 24-30.030, Florida Administrative Code, sets forth the requirements concerning a complete legal description of the territory which includes a reference to township, range, land section and county. The description may have references to sections or partial sections, or metes and bounds references that include all bearings and distances necessary to provide a continuous description. The rule specifies that the description should not rely on references to government lots, local streets, recorded plats or lots, tracts, or other recorded instruments. The utility's territory description on file with the Commission employs the use of recorded plats and tracts, and therefore needs to be revised.

The information you provided on October 8, 2004 regarding your application for transfer of majority organizational control of L.W.V. Utilities, Inc. was reviewed by staff. This letter addresses the deficiencies and additional information needed regarding your application.

#### **Deficiencies**

1. Tariff Sheets. Pursuant to Rule 25-30.037(3)(j), Florida Administrative Code, the applicant shall provide an original and two copies of the sample tariff sheets reflecting the change in ownership, the new issuing officers, and the name of the utility. Please provide a complete set of original tariffs for the system. The tariff should include a written description of the utility's service availability policy. A copy of the tariffs can be accessed from the Commission website: www.floridapsc.com.

2. Notice. Rules 25-30.030, Florida Administrative Code, sets forth the requirements for providing notice of the application. The territory description provided in the utility's legal notice for this case is

inadequate because of the lack of reference to township, range and land section. Therefore, the utility must renotice and provide the required affidavits. It would be acceptable if the above references were incorporated with the utility previously submitted notice. The notice should start off CMP as follows: "Providing service to customers of LWV Utilities, Inc., in a portion of Section 3, Township 26 South, Range 16 East, located in the Lakewood Villas subdivision . . ." In addition to the problem COM mentioned above, the date of notice given and the actual published date by the West Pasco Press were apart by four days. This may be misleading to the public. To allow for the required 30 days CTR \_\_\_\_ protest period availability, the date of notice given should be the same as the published date. Also, ECR please refer to the application as a "transfer of majority organizational control" in the first paragraph of the notice. Please be advised that the governmental noticing list that was provided GCL \_\_\_\_ expires on November 27, 2004. If noticing can't be completed on or before November 27, 2004 you will need to request an updated list. OPC \_\_\_\_ MMS \_\_\_\_\_\_3 Customer deposits. Pursuant to Rule 25-30.311(5), Florida Administrative Code, after a customer has established a satisfactory payment record and has had continuous service for a period of 23 months, the utility will refund the customer's deposits with interest. According to the staff's audit report, the utility has not been charging the approved tariff rate for customer deposits or refunding SCR \_\_\_\_ those deposits, with interest as required by Rule 25-30.311(4) and (5), Florida Administrative Code. Please provide a statement indicating your understanding of the utility's authority to collect customer

deposits. In addition, please provide a statement indicating how you intend to comply with Rule 25-30.311, Florida Administrative Code.

4. Services. Please provide a description of the operating and maintenance services provided by contract personnel or employees of the utility, including the names, duties, and Department Environmental of Protection operating certificate numbers of the plant operators. If services to operate and manage the utility are under contract, please provide a copy of the contract.
