VERIZON FLORIDA INC.'S ERRATA TO CORRECT TITLE OF FILING

On December 23, 2004, Verizon Florida Inc. ("Verizon") filed a Petition for Reconsideration of the Order Establishing Procedure in this case ("Petition"). That filing should have been entitled a Motion for Modification of the Order Establishing Procedure, rather than a Petition for Reconsideration.

Verizon's filing asked for modification of the procedural schedule and deletion of one of the issues from the Tentative Issues List attached to the Procedural Order. These are procedural matters properly and routinely considered by the Prehearing Officer, rather than the Commission. Verizon intended for the Prehearing Officer to consider its requests, but inadvertently entitled its filing a Petition for Reconsideration, which might be interpreted to indicate that the Commission should rule on the filing.
