
Consistent with the Commission's July 19, 2002 Order, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. ("BellSouth") is filing a Proposed Notification Report for the April 2005 data month and a Preliminary Notification Report for the data month of May 2005. These proposed changes will be discussed at the March 7, 2005 industry conference call.

There is one additional matter that BellSouth would like to bring to the attention of the Commission and the parties. Upon completion of Encore Release 17.0, which was implemented on November 21, 2004, it was determined that some LSRs previously counted as Partially Mechanized were being incorrectly counted as Fully Mechanized. BellSouth will correct this issue with the January 2005 data month.

PROPOSED APRIL 2005 DATA NOTIFICATION

BellSouth proposes making the changes described in this document to generate results for the April 2005 data month. Results for the April 2005 data month will be posted as follows:

Preliminary results May 20, 2005
Final results May 31, 2005

BellSouth provides Data Notifications each month in compliance with the Georgia Public Service Commission's Order of July 19, 2002. This order specifies that when BellSouth proposes making any changes to the methods by which performance data is calculated, it must provide written notice. This notice must be provided on the first business day of the month before the data month in which the change will be made. BellSouth must also provide notification if it is considering making changes to the method of calculating data for the following month.

The "Affected Measures" described in this notice are those set forth in the Georgia Service Quality Measurement ("SQM") Plan, unless otherwise noted. All "Impact of Change" descriptions are stated at the measurement level, unless the sub-metric level is specified.

ENCORE Releases may affect monthly data flows from the source systems (e.g., LEO, LESOG, etc.) that PMAP uses to calculate measurements. Bellsouth will make changes to PMAP to ensure that data continues to be correctly captured as ENCORE Releases are implemented.

Ordering Measurements

- (1) *Affected Measures:* O-3 & O-4

Description of Change: Currently, the Flow-Through code is incorrectly counting LSRs submitted via ELMS6 to cancel previous submissions as BST errors. BellSouth proposes to correctly classify these LSRs as Flow-Through. This proposed change was Item (1) on the Preliminary April Data Notification filed on February 1, 2005. (RQ6010)

Impact of Change: For December 2004 data, there were 1036 of these LSRs. Flow Through percentages would have increased less than 1%.

- (2) *Affected Measures:* O-3 & O-4

Description of Change: Currently, Flow-Through LSRs submitted via XML or EDI, which have related PONs (RPONs) and are manually clarified, are being incorrectly counted as BellSouth errors. BellSouth proposes to correct the code to accurately report these LSRs as CLEC errors. This proposed change was Item (2) on the Preliminary April Data Notification filed on February 1, 2005. (RQ6011)

Impact of Change: For November 2004, there would have been a .002% increase in the results.

- (3) *Affected Measures:* OSS-2

Description of Change: Currently, performance for EDI interactive agent is not reported for this measure. BellSouth proposes to report interactive agent availability minutes as a part of EDI. (RQ6078)

Impact of Change: From August 2004 to January 2005, there were no interactive agent outages.

- (4) *Affected Measures:* OSS-2

Description of Change: Currently, the raw data for OSS-2 includes a listing for CLEC TAFI, LMOS, and TAFI records, which are associated only with the M&R Interface Availability Measure (OSS-3). BellSouth proposes to remove this erroneous raw data from the file. (RQ6164)

Impact of Change: None to measurement results.

Provisioning Measurements

- (5) *Affected Measures:* P-2A

Description of Change: When CSOTS was established, it was updated once a day. To account for the possibility that a CLEC might not be notified of a Non-Mechanized Jeopardy status for up to one day after it occurred, the Non-Mechanized Jeopardy Notice Interval was reduced by 1 day. CSOTS is now updated real time and BellSouth proposes to modify the PMAP code to report the actual measured Jeopardy Notice Interval. This proposed change was Item (3) on the Preliminary April Data Notification filed on February 1, 2005. (RQ5998)

Impact of Change: For November 2004, in Georgia, the Non-Mechanized Average Jeopardy Notice Interval (provided in advance of jeopardy) for DS1 Loops would increase by 8.87%.

- (6) *Affected Measures:* P-4

Description of Change: Currently, the CLEC numerator on the 12 month report is reported in whole rounded numbers. BellSouth proposes to change the CLEC numerator on the report to 2 decimal places which is already used to calculate the result. This

proposed change was Item (4) on the Preliminary April Data Notification filed on February 1, 2005. (RQ6029)

Impact of Change: None to measurement results.

Change Management Measurements

(7) *Affected Measures:* CM-8

Description of Change: Currently, the report for this measurement is not disaggregated as stated in the SQM. BellSouth proposes to correct PMAP to correctly display these disaggregations. (RQ6071)

Impact of Change: None to the aggregate measurement results.

PRELIMINARY MAY 2005 DATA NOTIFICATION

BellSouth is considering making the changes described in this document to generate results for the May 2005 data month. Results for the May 2005 data month will be posted as follows:

Preliminary results June 20, 2005
Final results June 30, 2005

BellSouth provides Data Notifications each month in compliance with the Georgia Public Service Commission's Order of July 19, 2002. This order specifies that when BellSouth proposes making any changes to the methods by which performance data is calculated, it must provide written notice. This notice must be provided on the first business day of the month before the data month in which the change will be made. BellSouth must also provide notification if it is considering making changes to the method of calculating data for the following month.

The "Affected Measures" described in this notice are those set forth in the Georgia Service Quality Measurement (SQM) Plan, unless otherwise noted. All "Impact of Change" descriptions are stated at the measurement level, unless the sub-metric level is specified.

ENCORE Releases may affect monthly data flows from the source systems (e.g., LEO, LESOG, etc.) that PMAP uses to calculate measurements. Bellsouth will make changes to PMAP to ensure that data continues to be correctly captured as ENCORE Releases are implemented.

Provisioning Measurements

- (1) *Affected Measures:* P-3 (Florida and Tennessee)

Description of Change: Currently in Florida & Tennessee, BellSouth is excluding orders that are canceled on the due date but are not zero due dated orders. Per the SQM, only orders canceled prior to the due date and zero due dated orders canceled on the due date should be excluded from this measure. BellSouth proposes to exclude only orders canceled prior to the due date and zero due dated orders canceled on the due date from this measure. (RQ6033)

Impact of Change: There is no change in reported measurement results for BST. The impact to the CLEC results is less than 0.01%.

- (2) *Affected Measures:* P-2, P-3, P-4, P-5, P-6, P-9, P-10 & P-11

Description of Change: Currently, certain administrative orders (i.e., "C" orders with D&E entries) were not being excluded in the code. BellSouth proposes to correct the code to properly exclude these orders. (RQ6039)

Impact of Change: For November 2004, in Florida, for PMIA BellSouth Retail Residence, 19843 records would have been excluded from the volume of completed orders with a change in the missed appointment rate from .67% to .69%. For Florida CLEC Resale Residence, one (1) record would have been excluded from the volume of completed orders with no change in the missed appointment rate (.37%).

- (3) *Affected Measures:* P-7, P-7A, P-7B & P-7C

Description of Change: Currently, records are being excluded because WFA completion dates and service order completion dates do not match. BellSouth proposes to modify PMAP data processing to include these records if the WFA completion date is within 10 days of the service order completion date. A 10-day interval should capture virtually all instances for this situation. (RQ6059)

Impact of Change: For December 2004, in Florida, two service orders (4 items) were excluded from CCCI. The results were:

929/933 = 99.5712%

Adjusted results:

933/937 = 99.5731%

For December 2004, in Georgia, three service orders (13 items) were excluded from CCCI. The results were:

209/209 = 100%

Adjusted results:

222/222 = 100%

M&R Measurements

- (4) *Affected Measures:* MR-3 (Florida and Tennessee)

Description of Change: Currently, the Z scores are not being calculated for Digital Loops <DS1 and Digital Loops >= DS1. Bellsouth proposes to begin calculating the Z score for Digital Loops <DS1 and Digital Loops >=DS1 product groups. (RQ6112)

Impact of Change: None to measurement results.
