D. STATEMENT OF BASIC POSITION

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Tampa Electric's Statement of Basic Position:

The Commission should determine that Tampa Electric has properly calculated its conservation cost recovery true-up and projections and that the appropriate conservation cost recovery factor to be applied by Tampa Electric during the period January 2006 through December 2006 is 0.048 cents per KWH for Interruptible, 0.076 cents per KWH for Residential, 0.070 cents per KWH for General Service Non-Demand and Temporary Service, 0.060 cents per KWH for General Service Demand – Secondary, 0.060 cents per KWH for General Service Demand – Secondary, 0.060 cents per KWH for General Service Demand – Secondary, 0.060 cents per KWH for General Service Demand and Firm Standby – Secondary, 0.056 cents per KWH for General Service Large Demand and Firm Standby – Primary, 0.055 cents per KWH for General Service Large Demand and Firm Standby – Subtransmission, and 0.024 cents per KWH for Lighting.

The Commission should also approve the \$5.17 per KW Contracted Credit Value Tampa Electric has calculated for the GSLM-2 and GSLM-3 rate riders for use during the period January 2006 through December 2006.

<u>E.</u> STATEMENT OF ISSUES AND POSITIONS

Generic Conservation Cost Recovery Issues

<u>ISSUE_1</u> :	What are the appropriate final conservation cost recovery true-up amounts for the period January 2004 through December 2004?	
TECO:	An over-recovery of \$2,405,000, including interest. (Witness: Bryant)	
<u>ISSUE 2</u> :	What are the appropriate conservation cost recovery factors for the period January 2006 through December 2006?	
<u>TECO</u> :	 0.048 cents per KWH for Interruptible 0.076 cents per KWH for Residential 0.070 cents per KWH for General Service Non-Demand and Temporary Service 0.060 cents per KWH for General Service Demand –Secondary 	

- 0.060 cents per KWH for General Service Demand– Primary
- 0.057 cents per KWH for General Service Large Demand and Firm Standby Secondary
- 0.056 cents per KWH for General Service Large Demand and Firm Standby Primary
- 0.055 cents per KWH for General Service Large Demand and Firm Standby Subtransmission
- 0.024 cents per KWH for Lighting (Witness: Bryant)
- <u>ISSUE 3</u>: What should be the effective date of the energy conservation cost recovery factors for billing purposes?
- TECO: The factors should be effective beginning with the specified conservation cost recovery cycle and thereafter for the period January, 2006 through December, 2006. Billing cycles may start before January 1, 2006, and the last cycle may be read after December 31, 2006, so long as each customer is billed for 12 months regardless of when the factors became effective. (Witness: Bryant)

Company-Specific Conservation Cost Recovery Issues

Tampa Electric Company:

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- <u>ISSUE 4</u>: What is the Contracted Credit Value for the GSLM-2 and GSLM-3 rate riders for Tampa Electric for the period January 2006 through December 2006?
- <u>TECO</u> In accordance with Order No. PSC-99-1778-FOF-EI, issued September 10, 1999 in Docket No. 990037-EI, Tampa Electric has calculated that, for the forthcoming cost recovery period, January 2006 through December 2006, the Contracted Credit Value for the GSLM-2 and GSLM-3 rate riders will be \$5.17 per KW. (Witness: Bryant)

<u>F.</u> STIPULATED ISSUES

Tampa Electric is not aware of any stipulated issues as of this date.
