In accordance with the Florida Public Service Commission ("Commission") Order No. PSC-04-0456-FOF-TL, Qwest is filing the following tariff changes to comply with the Commission's interexchange carrier ("IXC") flow through order requiring tariff modifications to account for retail Residential and Business switched access saving. The changes reflected in the tariff will be effective on February 1, 2007.

The Commission order requires an IXC's tariff filing specifically include several items.

(1) A calculation of the dollar benefit associated with the ILEC's intrastate access rate reduction.

Quest determined the dollar benefit associated with Bell South's intrastate access rate reduction in the following manner:

Quest's total flow through rate reductions for residential customers amount to **[REDACTED]** and the rate reductions for business customers equal **[REDACTED]** which together total **[REDACTED]** in annual reductions. The savings received from the ILEC reductions indicated that Quest needed to flow through to retail customers **[REDACTED]**. Therefore, Quest has reduced long distance rates for residential and business customers at the same level as savings realized on those products with the switched access reductions by Bell South.

The information contained in Confidential Attachment A is proprietary confidential business information pursuant to Florida Statutes Section 366.093 (3) (e) (2005).
