RE: Request for Expedited NPA-NXX Relief for the Jacksonville Rate Center with Confidential Treatment of Certain Customer and Company Data

US LEC of Florida Inc., d/b/a PAETEC Business Services (Company) seeks expedited review and intervention of the Commission in securing an NPA-NXX assignment for customer use in the Jacksonville Rate Center. The Company, recently requested two 1000 blocks of numbers (2,000 numbers) for the Jacksonville rate center from NeuStar. The impetus for the request was the need for a block of numbers to support a new customer that desired 1,500 numbers (confidential customer letter attached) to support its business operations, allow internal movement of employees, and utilize 4-digit dialing.

Multiple times in February and on March 9, 2007, the Company requested 2,000 numbering resources from NeuStar. Attached is a copy of the latest Company request for numbering resources issued to NeuStar (three pages). Also attached is a copy of the utilization data that is a part of that request (two pages). NeuStar issued provided notice to the Company that it would provide one 1,000 block to the Company and rejected the second 1,000 block on the basis that the Company had requested more blocks than it would exhaust in six months (Page 1 of 1). Additionally, as supplemental documentation, confidential copy of the Company's internal

CMP documentation of its utilization in the Jacksonville rate center is enclosed. COM The Company does not have the NPA-NXX resources in the Jacksonville Rate Center sufficient to provide the requested 1,500 consecutive numbers requested by its customer. The Company is ECR unable to provide the services requested by its customer because of NeuStar's failure to supply GCL \_\_\_\_all of the necessary resources, a block of 2,000 consecutive numbers, from which 1,500 will be assigned to the customer. Because of NeuStar's failure to assign the required numbering resources, the customer cannot obtain service for the block of 1,500 telephone numbers from the RCA \_\_\_\_Company, the customer's provider of choice. US LEC requests that the Commission intervene on its behalf to secure a block of 2,000 SGA \_\_\_\_\_consecutive numbers in the NPA 904 from Neustar, preferably, in the 2xxx-3xxx range. Alternatively, the customer can use numbers from the 4xxx, 5xxx, 6xxx, or 7xxx blocks that are oth \_\_\_\_\_ consecutive. The customer's project begins in April 2007. In accordance with FCC orders and

NeuStar's Central Office Code Guidelines, provide that state regulatory authorities have the power and authority to review NeuStar's decision to deny a request for numbering resources. In the investigation of utilization, the Company notes that if the requested 2,000 block is issued and the additional 1,500 lines are assigned, the Company's utilization rate in the Jacksonville Rate Center will still be at least 88.6 percent.

The Company requests the Commission review the decision of NeuStar to deny the Company's request for additional numbering resources and direct NeuStar to provide numbers sufficient to meet the requirements of the Company's business customer in the Jacksonville Rate Center and provide confidential treatment to certain pages stamped "Confidential" pursuant to Rule 25 22.006 (FLA), and Section 364.183, Florida Statutes.
