In accordance with Public Service Commission Order No. PSC-07-0130-SC-SU, Alafaya Utilities, Inc., is filing this quarterly report on the progress of reuse improvements as follows:

- Augmentation Wells Alafaya Utilities, Inc., is in discussions with the owner of four (4) existing agricultural wells which the Utility believes will be more cost effective than installing new wells.
- Reuse from City Representatives of Alafaya met with the City's Staff in March and the City does expect to have some amount of surplus reuse when the connection is made with the Iron Bridge WWTP, however, the City is offering that reuse at a price greater than what Alafaya Utilities has been authorized by the Commission to charge its customers.
- Metering The Utility is obtaining pricing for meter installations and expects to commence installing meters in the near future.
