On August 14, 2007, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Florida (AT&T Florida) filed its Notice of Intent to Request Specified Confidential Classification pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(3)(a), Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), for its responses to Florida Public Service Commission Staff's (Staff) Second Set of Interrogatories No. 33. In response to Staff's Second Set of Interrogatories No. 33, AT&T Florida produced documents it considers to contain confidential business information. The document was assigned FPSC Document No. 07158-07.

On September 04, 2007, BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Florida filed its Request for Specified Confidential Classification, pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, F.A.C. and Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, for certain information contained in FPSC Document No. 07158-07. Attached to its request, AT&T Florida submitted another copy of the document previously identified as FPSC Document No. 07158-07. The second copy was identified as FPSC Document No. 08030-07.

AT&T Florida claims the information in Document Nos. 07158-07 and 08030-07
contains confidential business information related to competitive interests of AT&T Florida that
is considered proprietary by AT&T Florida. AT&T Florida claims that public disclosure of this
information would cause competitive harm to AT&T Florida. The information pertains to AT&T Florida's number of customers broken down by the type of service that they order.
Upon review of the information contained in the documents, technical staff concurs with AT&T Florida that the information meets the requirements for confidential classification
pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006(5), Florida Administrative
Code, and the information should be treated as confidential.
