SBC Long Distance, LLC, d/b/a AT&T Long Distance Service ("SBC LD"), applies for authority under Section 214(a) of the Communications Act, as amended ("the Act"), 47 U.S.C. § 214, and Section 63.71 of the Federal Communications Commission's ("Commission") rules, 47 C.F.R. §63.71, to discontinue the following services: Dedicated Voice Access ("DVA"), ISDN ("PRI"), and Dedicated Toll Free Services ("DTFS").

As required by Section 63.71(a) and (b) of the Commission's rules, SBC LD is providing the following information:

SBC LD will no longer offer these services to new customers on or after November 12, 2007, subject to Commission authorization of the discontinuance pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 63.71(c).

SBC LD will continue to provide services to its existing customers until their existing contracts expire or are terminated.

Points of Geographic Areas of Service Affected (47 C.F.R. §§ 63.71(a)(3), b(2)):

SBC LD will discontinue these services in the 48 contiguous states, Hawaii and the District of Columbia.

Brief Description of Type of Service Affected (47 C.F.R. §§ 63.71(a)(3), b(2)):

- 1. Dedicated Voice Access provides dedicated access to voice trunking. DVA transport carries calls made on voice trunks bypassing the local switch.
- 2. ISDN(PRI) Service is a channelized access line that provides Q931 signaling between the SBCLD POP and the customer premise equipment.
- 4. Dedicated Toll Free Service (DTFS) is in-bound toll free long distance calling over dedicated access lines facilities.

As a result of the acquisition of AT&T Corp. and its subsidiaries by SBC Communications Inc., the combined entity is streamlining their services portfolio. If this Application is approved, the services described above, currently provided by SBC LD, will be provided by another affiliate of AT&T.

The public convenience and necessity will not be impaired by this service discontinuance because there are many alternative providers of business services, including but not limited to SBC LD's affiliate AT&T Corp. Furthermore, none of the affected customers should experience a loss in service as AT&T plans to offer a comparable suite of services to these customers through another AT&T affiliate.

Brief Description of the Dates and Methods of Notice to All Affected Customers (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(b)(3)):

SBC LD notified customers of its intention to discontinue these services by letter sent via U.S. Mail on September 24, 2007. A sample of the letter is attached hereto as Attachment A.

Copies of this Application are being sent, first class U.S. Mail, to the public utilities commission and governor of each state in which discontinuance is proposed and also to the Special Assistant for Telecommunications to the Secretary of Defense, as required by 63.71(a) of the Commission's rules.

Regulatory Classification of Carrier (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(b)(4)):

SBC LD is considered non-dominant with respect to the services to be discontinued.
