

**TALLAHASSEE** — The following items are among those scheduled for consideration by the Commission at the May 8, 2007, Agenda Conference:

ITEM 3: DOCKET NO. 040763-TP – REQUEST FOR SUBMISSION OF PROPOSALS FOR RELAY SERVICE, BEGINNING IN JUNE 2005, FOR THE HEARING AND SPEECH IMPAIRED, AND OTHER IMPLEMENTATION MATTERS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE FLORIDA TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACCESS SYSTEM ACT OF 1991. The Commission will consider a staff recommendation on the budget and advisory committee of Florida Telecommunications Relay, Inc., a non-profit corporation handling relay services.

ITEM 6: DOCKET NO. 060198-EI – REQUIREMENT FOR INVESTOR-OWNED ELECTRIC UTILITIES TO FILE ONGOING STORM PREPAREDNESS PLANS AND IMPLEMENTATION COST ESTIMATES. The Commission will consider a staff recommendation on Florida Power & Light's vegetation management program in the City of North Miami.

# FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION APPROVES MODIFICATIONS TO GULF POWER CONSERVATION PROGRAMS

**TALLAHASSEE** — The Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) today approved modifications to existing advanced geothermal system conservation programs offered by Gulf Power Company (Gulf) aimed at reducing energy demand and increasing customer participation in the programs.

These initiatives are expected to reduce the growth rate of weather-sensitive peak demand, reduce and control the growth rate of energy consumption, and increase conservation of expensive fossil fuel resources. The changes will benefit all of Gulf's customers, not just those participating in the modified programs.

"I can not overstate the importance of conservation and energy efficiency for consumers and for Florida's economy," said PSC Chairman Lisa Polak Edgar. "By making energy-efficient choices, consumers can reduce energy consumption, reduce costs, and strengthen Florida's energy security for years to come."

Business and residential customers who install energy-efficient geothermal heat pumps (GHP) will receive an increased incentive payment. GHPs use the temperature of the earth as the heat exchange medium instead of air. Since the earth remains at a relatively constant temperature, the ground is both warmer in winter and cooler in summer than the surrounding air. GHP technology takes advantage of this temperature difference by exchanging heat with the earth through a series of pipes buried underground.

Gulf serves approximately 394,772 retail customers between the Alabama border and the Apalachicola River. In all, Gulf Power serves customers in 71 cities and communities in Florida.
