NOTICE is hereby given that the Florida Public Service Commission will hold service and technical hearings in the above docket on the application of Sun River Utilities, Inc., to amend its Certificates Nos. 611-W and 527-S, and the protest of Charlotte County to that application. The rates and charges of the current customers will not be changed in this amendment proceeding. If an amendment is granted, the utility will charge customers in the amended territory the rates and charges currently approved by the Commission until a change in rates and charges is approved by the Commission. The hearings will commence at the time and location shown below and will continue until all witnesses have been heard. CUSTOMERS WHO WISH TO PRESENT TESTIMONY ARE URGED TO APPEAR PROMPTLY AT EACH SCHEDULED HEARING TIME SINCE THE HEARING MAY BE ADJOURNED EARLY IF NO WITNESSES ARE PRESENT TO TESTIFY.

The technical portion of the hearing will commence at the conclusion of each portion of the customer testimony, and will continue at the same location on THURSDAY, JANUARY 17, 2008, if needed.

PURPOSE AND PROCEDURE

The purpose of these service and technical hearings shall be to take testimony, to include customer testimony, on the proposed amendment of Sun River Utilities, Inc.'s Certificates Nos. 611-W and 527-W. The procedure at these hearings shall be as follows: Any pending motions will first be addressed and then members of the public may present testimony. At the conclusion of each portion of the customers' testimony, technical witnesses will present testimony in the order set forth in the Prehearing Order. Members of the public who wish to present testimony are urged to appear promptly at each scheduled hearing time since the hearing may be adjourned early if no witnesses are present to testify. All witnesses shall be subject to cross examination at the conclusion of their testimony.

ADDITIONAL NOTICE

To ensure that the public is made aware of the public hearing scheduled in this matter, Sun River Utilities, Inc., prior to the hearings scheduled herein, is directed to enclose in all customers' bills, or in a separate mailing to all customers, a notice setting forth fully the time and place of these hearings and a statement that "persons who wish to present testimony are urged to appear at the beginning of the hearing since the hearing may be adjourned early if no witnesses are present to testify." The notice shall be completed at least fourteen (14) days before the first scheduled hearing. The Company is also directed to publish in a newspaper of general circulation in the area in which a hearing is to be held, a display advertisement stating the time, date, location and purpose of the hearing and a statement that "persons who wish to present testimony are urged to appear at the beginning of the hearing since the hearing may be adjourned early if no witnesses are present to testify." The advertisements shall be published at least seven (7) days and not more than twenty (20) days before each service hearing.

JURISDICTION

Jurisdiction over this utility is vested in the Commission by Chapter 367, Florida Statutes; authority to approve any amendment is governed by Section 367.045, Florida Statutes. The provisions of Chapters 25-22 and 25-30, Florida Administrative Code, are also applicable.
