# TAMPA ELECTRIC COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER

Tampa Electric Company ("Tampa Electric" or "the company"), pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(6)(c), Florida Administrative Code, hereby requests the entry of a temporary protective order protecting certain information to be supplied to Office of Public Counsel ("OPC") and exempting same from public disclosure, and as grounds therefore, says:

1. OPC has requested an opportunity to review certain documents relating to Tampa Electric's procurement of new solid fuel transportation agreements.

2. Rule 25-22.006(6)(c), Florida Administrative Code, provides that a utility or other person may agree to allow public counsel to inspect certain documents on a confidential basis and may request a temporary protective order exempting the information from the public records law. The rule goes on to discuss potential use of the information in question at hearing and the return of the information to the provider.

3. Tampa Electric is in need of a temporary protective order pursuant to the rule in order to safeguard information provided to OPC for review in this matter.
