RE: Docket 080007-EI, Recommendation concerning Florida Power & Light Company's (FPL's) request for confidential classification concerning a portion of the staff audit working papers prepared during "Florida Power & Light Environmental Cost Recovery Clause Audit for the Historical Year Ended December 31, 2007", Audit Control No. 08-029-4-1, Documents Numbered 06388-08 and 06762-08

On July 11, 2008, when copies of certain portions of staff's audit working papers obtained or prepared during the "Florida Power & Light Environmental Cost Recovery Clause Audit for the Historical Year Ended December 31, 2007", were delivered to FPL at the audit exit conference, the utility requested that these materials be temporarily exempted from public access in accordance with provisions of Rule 25-22.006(3)(a)2., Florida Administrative Code (FAC).

On July 23, 2008, staff filed document numbered 06388-08 consisting of those specified portions of the staff's audit report and working papers.

On August 1, 2008, FPL filed a request pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (F.S) and Rule 25-22.006, FAC, that selected portions of the working papers prepared by the staff during the audit receive a confidential classification. The utility's request included redacted copies for public inspection (Document No. 06763-08) and copies with the sensitive material highlighted (Document 06762-08).

Documents numbered 06388-08 and 06762-08 are currently held by the Office of the Commission Clerk as confidential pending resolution of FPL's request for confidential classification.

COMPursuant to Section 119.07, F.S., documents submitted to this Commission are public records.COMThe only exceptions to this law are specific statutory exemptions and exemptions granted by

Subsection 366.093(3), F.S., provides; "Proprietary confidential business information means information, regardless of form or characteristics, which is owned or controlled by the person or company, is intended to be and is treated by the person or company as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to the ratepayers or the person's or company's business operations, and has not been disclosed unless disclosed pursuant to a statutory provision, an order of a court or administrative body, or private agreement that provides that the information will not be released to the public. Proprietary confidential business information includes but is not limited to:

(b) Internal auditing controls and reports of internal auditors.

••••

(d) Information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms.

(e) Information relating to competitive business interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information....''

According to Section 366.093, F.S., and Rule 25-22.006, FAC, the utility has the burden of demonstrating that materials qualify for confidential classification. According to Rule 25-22.006, FAC, the utility must meet this burden by demonstrating that the information is proprietary confidential business information, the disclosure of which will cause the utility, the provider of the information or the ratepayer harm.

Staff Analysis of the Request

Reading the filing reveals the sensitive material consists of:

1. Internal Auditing Controls and Reports of Internal Auditors

By way of an affidavit, Robert Onsgard, FPL Manager, Internal Auditing, identifies information reporting internal auditing information within the staff working paper titled: "List of Internal Audits."

Section 366.093(3)(b), Florida Statutes, provides the Commission may grant information pertaining to internal auditing controls and reports of internal auditors a confidential classification. We have read the material identified by Mr. Onsgard and agree it reports sensitive information relating to the utility's internal auditing programs. We therefore recommend this material be granted a confidential classification.

Staff Analysis of the Request (continued)

2. Contractual Information such as Pricing and Other Terms.

By way of an affidavit, Roger F. Messer, FPL Director, Environmental Services, identifies sensitive contractual information as well as sensitive competitive business information within the staff's working papers titled: "Testing of Cash Vouchers", "Testing of Journal Vouchers", and "Journal Entries." Further, Mr. Messer asserts release of this contractual information would impair the efforts of FPL to contract for goods and services on favorable terms and could also impair the competitive business of FPL and its vendors.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 366.093(3)(d), F.S., the Commission may grant a confidential classification to sensitive contractual information if release would impair the ability of the utility or its affiliates to contract favorably for goods and services. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 366.093(3)(e), F.S., the Commission may grant a confidential classification to sensitive competitive business information if release would harm the provider of the information.

We have read the information identified by Mr. Messer and agree it is sensitive contractual and competitive business information; therefore, we recommend that this material be granted a confidential classification.

Information Held as Confidential

To qualify as proprietary confidential business information, the material must also be held as private and not released to the public. FPL asserts that this sensitive information meets the statutory restrictions necessary for the material to be provided a confidential classification and asserts that the information has not been disclosed to the Public. Further, Mr. Onsgard and Mr. Messer, FPL employees, assert FPL has maintained the confidentiality of these materials.

Duration of the Confidential Classification Period

FPL requests that this material be held as confidential for at least 18 months and that this material should be returned to FPL once the information is no longer needed for the Commission to conduct its business.

According to the provisions of Section 366.093(4), F.S., absent good cause shown, confidential classification is limited to 18 months. Without cause shown for a longer period, we recommend that the period of confidential classification be set as 18 months. As deemed necessary, the utility may request an extension of the confidential classification before the period tolls.

Staff Recommendation

Based upon reading the filing, and for the reasons presented above, we recommend the utility's request be granted and that the identified material be granted a confidential classification for 18 months.

REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF INFORMATION PROVIDED PURSUANT TO AUDIT NO. 08-029-4-1

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") requests confidential classification of certain information provided to the Florida Public Service Commission ("FPSC" or "Commission") staff ("Staff") in connection with its audit of FPL's Environmental Cost Recovery Clause (Audit Control No. 08-029-4-1; hereinafter the "ECRC Audit") in this docket. In support of its Request, FPL states as follows:

1. During the ECRC Audit, Staff requested access to various FPL reports and other documents, portions of which became working papers of the auditors. By letter dated and the 2008, Staff indicated its intent to retain certain working papers for which confidential treatment previously had been requested (the "Working Papers"). Pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(3)(a), FPL was given 21 days from the date of that letter, or until August 1, 2008, to file a formal request for confidential classification with respect to the Working Papers. This Request is intended to request confidential classification of the confidential portions of the Working Papers consistent with Rule 25-22.006(3)(a).

2. The following exhibits are included with and made a part of this request:

Composite Exhibit A consists of copies of the Working Papers, on which all information that FPL asserts is entitled to confidential treatment has been highlighted. Composite Exhibit A is submitted separately in a sealed folder marked "CONFIDENTIAL."

b. Composite Exhibit B consists of an edited version of Exhibit A on which all information FPL asserts is entitled to confidential treatment has been redacted.

c. Exhibit C is a table containing a line-by-line and page-by-page identification of the information for which confidential classification is sought, and, with regard to each document or portions thereof, references to the specific statutory basis or bases for the claim of confidentiality and to the affidavits in support of the requested classification.

d. Exhibit D is comprised of the affidavits of Roger Messer and Robert Onsgard.

3. **TPD seeks confidential protection** for the information highlighted in Exhibit A. **W** The Highlighted information is proprietary confidential business information within the meaning in Section 366.093(3). The information is intended to be, and has been, treated by FPL as

4. Pursuant to Section 366.093, the information highlighted in Exhibit A is entitled to confidential treatment and is exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review, such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

5. The statutory bases for FPL's assertion of confidentiality with regard to each document or portion thereof are set forth in Exhibit C under the column titled "FLORIDA

STATUTE 366.093(3)." The letters in that column refer to the subsection(s) of Section 366.093(3) that provide justification for FFL's request. Further support for FPL's request for confidential classification of the referenced information is provided through the affidavits that are included as Exhibit D to this Request.

6. Upon a finding by the Commission that the information highlighted in Exhibit A, and referenced in Exhibit C, is proprietary confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for a period of at least eighteen (18) months and should be returned to FPL as soon at the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. See § 366.093(4).

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that this Request be granted.


