Request for confidentiality of information claimed in staff's Review of Customer Property Damage Claims of Florida's Four Major Investor-Owned Electric Utilities;

Progress responses to data requests 1,2, and 3; and certain information contained in

staff's audit workpapers.

Upon review of Progress Energy Florida's request for confidentiality of items within the final report, document request responses, and staff's workpapers, I believe the information requested by the company should be given confidential treatment, pursuant to Florida Statute 366.093(3)(c) and 366.093(3)(e) as justified by the company.

The items identified in Progress Energy Florida's Exhibit C, and revised Exhibit C, identify information that the company believes could compromise the security of information related to claims payments and company procedures for claims decisions. Additionally, the company believes that this information, if disclosed, could impair its competitive business interests. Staff believes that the claims data identified by the company in both Exhibit Cs could possibly impact the company's security of sensitive claims information and, could possibly impair the company's competitive interests if disclosed to a competitor. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission approve Progress Energy Florida's request for confidentiality of the information filed in Docket No. 090041-EI.
