> Re: Lindrick Service Corporation 2009 General Rate Increase Application

Dear Chairman Carter:

Pursuant to Rule 25-30.430, Florida Administrative Code and through undersigned counsel, Lindrick Service Corporation (the "Company") respectfully requests approval of a test year. The Company intends to submit an application for general rate relief to the Florida Public Service Commission for its water and wastewater systems located in Pasco County, Florida. The Company intends to submit the minimum filing requirements ("MFRs") on or before August 31, 2009.

The Company's last rate proceeding was a limited proceeding rate case in Docket No. 980242-SU, wherein a Commission-mandated test year ending December 31, 1997 was utilized. That proceeding culminated in Proposed Agency Action Order No. PSC-99-1883-PAA-SU, issued September 21, 1999, which order was finalized and consummated by Order No. PSC-00-2241-AS-SU issued November 27, 2000.

The Company requests a projected test year ending December 31, 2010, for final rates, with interim rates based upon a test year ending June 30, 2009. The Company is requesting a projected test year for final rates because it believes that the use of a projected test year is more representative than the use a historical test year due to the extensive capital improvements that have been and will be installed during the projected years.

 Since the Company's last rate proceeding, the Company has completed or will be

 completing the construction of numerous additions, extensions, upgrades, and refurbishments to

 SSC
 its water system that are designed to keep the water system functioning properly and in

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compliance with environmental and water management district requirements. Those capital improvements include the following:

- Completion of new 15" main water service lines under Route 19, which includes direct bore, 15" HDPE line, connections, valves, and miscellaneous items.
- Completion of a new R.O. System (TDS/CL control), which includes a membrane system, piping, controls, valves, storage system, pumps, transmission system, new deep well, generator, disinfection, land, reject disposal system, and miscellaneous items.
- Replacement of cast iron water lines with new PVC water lines on Flormar Terrace, which includes piping, valves, restoration, and miscellaneous items.
- Refurbishment of well houses, which includes structural work, controls, piping replacements, new flow meters, alarms, electrical upgrading, and miscellaneous items.
- Replacement of all 2" domestic water service lines for the Shamrock Heights Development, which includes direct bore for 2" PVC, and all new service connections to the existing homes with valves, transitions, and miscellaneous items.

Since the Company's last rate proceeding, the Company also has completed or will be completing the construction of additions, upgrades, extensions, and refurbishments to its wastewater system to keep it functioning properly and in compliance with environmental and contractual requirements. Those capital improvements include the following:

- Addition of a new master lift station (LS-17), which includes structural (masonry/concrete) work, wall coatings, lift station fiberglass cover, piping, pumps, fittings, valves, controls, electrical and odor control system, and miscellaneous items.
- Addition of a new sanitary system for Shamrock Heights Development, which includes gravity lines, forced mains, lift station, traffic control, restoration, connections and miscellaneous items.
- Completion of I & I work for the Company's entire wastewater system, which includes locating infiltration, video lines, and repair, replace, grout or line piping and laterals.
- Upgrades to 16 lift stations, including odor control, pump replacement, rail replacement, lining, alarms, and miscellaneous items.

As part of its filing, the Company also intends to request rate relief for increased O & M expenses from the new R.O. system which includes the membrane system, treatment, gasifier maintenance, power, chemicals, manpower, equipment and replacements. Finally, the Company intends to request increased water and wastewater connection fees.

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Pursuant to Section 367.081(8), Florida Statutes, the Company requests that the Commission process this petition for rate relief using the proposed agency action procedure.
