We own a condo at Casa del Lago, 2835 Palo Verde Dr., Avon Park, FL 33825. We have always been charged fees for the over 6 months that we are NOT IN RESIDENCE there and believe this to be very unfair. We feel a nominal monthly maintenance fee for costs incurred would be more fair; this fee should be spread among their 278 customers.

Each month, we pay a water base facility charge of \$8.83 and a sewer base facility charge of \$16.59, even when we are not there from late April until the first week in November. This seems exorbitant and supplements Damon Utility considerably since there are many "snowbirds" among their 278 customers. So for six months, Damon is collecting \$152.52 from us when we are not there. To assess these costs among the many "snowbirds" who leave for the summer of the total 278 is free income, other than maintenance; for Damon Utilities.

If less than half leave for the summer, say just 100 customers for six months, that is an income for Damon of \$15,000. (prox.) each season. They should be made to justify these fees and their need for an increase in our water/sewer expenses.

This past season, the treatment plant was very noisy and annoying to nearby residents, so after complaints were made, the facility noise levels were decreased and this cost Damon. What did it cost them? What are the maintenance costs? The owners also turned on the lawn sprinklers during the heat of the day on their two condo units they are trying to sell; who is bearing this cost? Complaints by Casa residents were made and they quit the extra sprinkling of their sod areas around these two units. (The rest of the residents could only have weekly sprinkling due to the drought.)

WATER IS A VERY EXPENSIVE COMMODITY IN FLORIDA but we are urging your commission to be fair about this in your decision making. We are mostly pensioners on fixed incomes among their residents/customers and rate hikes are difficult to endure. We strongly oppose any increase in water/sewer rates; we feel Damon is gaining financially with so many "snowbirds" among the 278.



Dear Mr. ONeill:

Thank you for your e-mail dated June 10, 2009, in which you expressed your concerns about a rate increase by Damon Utilities, Inc. (Damon or Utility). To ensure that the Commission staff and the Commissioners have knowledge of your concerns, your e-mail has been placed on the correspondence side of the docket file for all to review.

I understand your concern regarding the payment of service when you are not in residence and this question is quite common. I would like to take this opportunity to explain why you are assessed charges even when you are away. The water lines that bring water to your home must be continually maintained to ensure they function properly everyday. The Utility faces costs to maintain the system and to ensure service is available whenever you turn on a faucet. While you may not require service every day of the year, service must be available at your demand. Most utilities, whether water, electric, or natural gas, operate the same way. A bill will be issued to the customer for a base charge that represents the costs necessary to maintain the system and meet its obligation to provide service whenever the customer requires it.

With respect to the development of rates, the Commission is required to set rates that are just, reasonable, compensatory, and not unfairly discriminatory. To determine the appropriate rates for service, the Commission uses a rate of return methodology as set forth in Chapter 367, Florida Statutes (F.S.). Under the rate of return methodology, a utility is allowed to earn a reasonable return on its prudently invested property that is used and useful in serving the public, less accrued depreciation plus an allowance for operating capital. This ratemaking process is used for all water and wastewater companies and is also used in the electric and gas industry. It is the same approach used throughout the country by various state and federal utility regulatory bodies.

Pursuant to Section 367.081(2), F.S., the Commission shall consider the cost of providing water and wastewater service, including debt interest, working capital, maintenance, depreciation, tax and operating expenses incurred in the operation of all property used and useful in public service. The Utility's rates are designed to recover, not only Damon's operating expenses, but also allow the Utility an opportunity to recover a fair rate of return on its

investment used to provide water and wastewater service to its customers. The fair rate of return is established by the Commission when making the final decision on Damon's request.

There are many factors that affect the cost of providing service and hence, the rates charged to customers. Some factors affecting the cost of providing service include: the size and age of the utility system; the quality of the water at its source; the number of customers; and, the geographic spread of the service area. In addition, government-run water and wastewater utilities are not required to pay federal income taxes which can also impact the level of rates charged.

Presently, the Commission's accountants, engineers and economists are examining the financial and engineering information filed by Damon. The Commission's auditors have also examined the Utility's records and have published the results of their findings in an audit report. Ultimately, all costs found to be imprudent or unreasonable will be disallowed for recovery in the rates paid by customers.

Again, thank you for taking the time to share your concerns with us. Information provided by customers, such as yourself, is an important part of the Commission's review of this case. The Commission staff is tentatively scheduled to file its recommendation on August 6, 2009. The Commissioners are tentatively scheduled to vote on this matter at its August 18, 2009, Agenda Conference.
