PURPOSE AND PROCEDURE:**

The purpose of this hearing will be for the Commission to take final action to determine the need, pursuant to Section 403.9422, Florida Statutes, for FPL's proposed natural gas transmission pipeline, the Florida EnergySecure Line, to be located in the following Florida countles: Bradford, Clay, Putnam, Flagler, Volusia, Seminole, Orange, Brevard, Osceola, Indian River, Okeechobee, St. Lucie, Martin and Palm Beach. This proceeding shall: (1) allow FPL to present evidence and testimony in support of its petition for a determination of need for its intrastate natural gas transmission pipeline:
