2	COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. We will now proceed
3	to the 07 docket. Starting with preliminary matters,
4	Ms. Brown, are there any preliminary matters that we
5	need to address before we get to the draft prehearing
6	order?
7	MS. BROWN: Staff is not aware of any
8	preliminary matters, Commissioner, but I would like
9	to point out that conversations with FIPUG and OPC have
10	indicated that they have no position on any of the
11	issues, so it appears that all the issues in this case
12	will be stipulated.
13	COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. Very well. Any
14	other preliminary matters?
15	MS. BROWN: Not that I am aware of.
16	COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. Hearing none, we
17	are going to move into the draft prehearing order.
18	Again, the same exercise. I will identify the sections.
19	If the parties have concerns with those if the
20	parties could bring those to my attention, any changes
21	or corrections that would need to be made, and then we
22	will hear from staff. Section I, Conduct of
23	Proceedings.
24	MS. BROWN: No changes.
25	COMMISSIONER SKOP: Section II, Case
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1 background. MS. BROWN: No changes. 2 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Section III, Jurisdiction. 3 MS. BROWN: No changes. 4 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Section IV, Procedure for 5 6 Handling Confidential Information. 7 MS. BROWN: No changes. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. Section V, Prefiled 8 9 Testimony, Exhibits, Witnesses. MS. BROWN: No changes. 10 11 MS. CHRISTENSEN: Commissioner, I would just 12 renew my objection in this section, which is 13 appropriate. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Very well. Objection is 14 noted for the record, and my ruling will be the same, 15 that friendly cross will be excluded. 16 Okay. Section V, any additional comments? 17 MS. BROWN: No, Commissioner. 18 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. Move on to 19 20 Section VI, Order of Witnesses. MS. BROWN: Commissioner, we note that 21 witnesses and exhibits will be stipulated into the 22 record in this case now that FIPUG and OPC will take no 23 position on it. We have a 15 couple of very minor typos that we can just point out to 16 staff subsequently on a couple of the issues in 17 Section VIII. 18 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Very well. Do you wish to 19 20 do this now or would you rather do it --21 MR. BUTLER: I can do them now. It won't take 22 long. 23 **COMMISSIONER SKOP:** Okay. MR. BUTLER: It's on Page 21, under the staff 24 25 position for Issue 9G. In the first line it says, you
