PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN CARTER: Now, Commissioners and staff, let's go ahead and get ready for Item Number 10.

(Pause.)

CHAIRMAN CARTER: Everybody ready? Staff, you're recognized.

MR. BROWN: Good morning. Shevie Brown from the Division of Regulatory Analysis.

Item 10 is Progress Energy Florida's petition for approval of a negotiated purchase power contract with Florida Biomass Energy. The conditions of the contract provide Progress to purchase 60 megawatts of biomass from Florida Biomass for a 20-year term commencing January 1st, 2013 through December 31st, 2032.

Staff analyzed the energy payments using the 2008 and 2009 standard offer contracts. The results tend to illustrate that Progress' customers could experience savings between 34.2 million up to 80.2 million. Staff recommends the proposed contract for approval. Not only will the modified contracts bring savings to Progress' ratepayers, but it will also result in the additional benefit of fuel diversity on the PEF system. We're available

for any questions you have.

CHAIRMAN CARTER: Okay. Thank you.

Commissioner Skop, you're recognized.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you, Mr.

Chairman. Just a couple of questions to staff. On Page 2 of the petition, and I don't know if they have that available, but Paragraph 4 on Page 2 of the filing petition indicated that the comparison was based on the 2008 10-year site plan fuel forecast and resulted in a ratepayer savings of approximately \$34.2 million over the life of the contract. What -- I guess, have these numbers been rerun for a more current fuel forecast?

MR. BROWN: Yes, sir, they have. We asked the company to provide us the 2009 fuel forecasts based on the 2009 standard offer contracts.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. And so that would be Page 8 of the revised recommendation, or the recommendation?

MR. BROWN: Correct.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. And if you could help me interpret that basically based on the revised fuel savings, it would be -- I guess, are those in thousands of dollars?

MR. BROWN: Well, it's in millions, but

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with -- the thousands, correct, I'm sorry.

commissioner skop: Okay. So, basically based on Page 8, the difference between -- in Column 13, the difference between the negotiated and the standard offer contract for 2009 shows a savings of -- is that, I guess \$80 million?

MR. BROWN: Correct.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. Why would that be noting that fuel has gone down?

MR. BALLINGER: I may be able to answer that. It's a combination. It's not only fuel prices, but it's also a change in the unit. The '08 standard offer was based on a combined cycle unit, the Suwannee unit which is no longer planned to be built. The 2009 standard offer contract is based on a CT which has a much higher heat rate, so any fuel impact you have is going to be much greater, and you can see that in the difference in the energy payments. That's really what's making up the difference.
