#### ORDER APPROVING LATE PAYMENT CHARGE

BY THE COMMISSION:

#### **Background**

Heather Hills Utilities, LLC (Heather Hills or Utility), is a Class C utility which provides service for approximately 354 water and wastewater customers in Manatee County. The Utility's 2008 annual report shows operating revenue of \$112,342 and a net operating loss of \$15,719.

On November 3, 2009, Heather Hills filed an application for approval of a late payment charge, which is the subject of this recommendation. We have jurisdiction pursuant to Section 367.091, Florida Statutes (F.S.).

#### **Discussion**

Section 367.091, F.S., authorizes us to establish, increase, or change a rate or charge other than monthly rates or service availability charges. Heather Hills has requested a \$5.00 late payment charge. The Utility's request for a late payment charge were accompanied by its reason for requesting the charges, as well as the cost justification required by Section 367.091, F.S. Heather Hills' cost analysis for its proposed late payment charge is shown on the attached Schedule No. 1.

The late payment fee is designed to encourage customers to pay their bills on time to ensure that the cost associated with late payment is not passed onto customers who do pay on time. The Utility's justification for the late payment charge is to place the burden of these costs on the cost causer rather than the general body of ratepayers. We find the estimated cost

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provided by the Utility is reasonable. In addition, we note that the Utility bills on a quarterly basis and must float its operational costs for a three month period. As such, customers that fail to pay their bills in a timely manner perpetuate the lag between costs being incurred and revenue being generated.

Based on the above, we approve Heather Hills' proposed late payment charge. The charges shall be effective for services rendered on or after the stamped approval date on the tariff sheets pursuant to Rule 25-30.475, Florida Administrative Code.

Based on the foregoing, it is

ORDERED by the Florida Public Service Commission that Heather Hills Utilities, LLC's requested late payment charge shall be approved. It is further

ORDERED that the late payment charge shall be effective for services rendered on or after the stamped approval date on the tariff sheets pursuant to Rule 25-30.475, Florida Administrative Code. It is further

ORDERED that if a protest is filed by a person whose interests are substantially affected within 21 days of issuance of the Order, the tariff shall remain in effect with any charges held subject to refund pending resolution of the protest and the docket shall remain open. It is further

ORDERED that if no timely protest is filed, the Order will become final upon the issuance of a Consummating Order and the docket shall be closed.

#### NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS

In the absence of such a petition, this Order shall become final and effective upon the issuance of a Consummating Order.

Any objection or protest filed in this docket before the issuance date of this order is considered abandoned unless it satisfies the foregoing conditions and is renewed within the specified protest period.
