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## PROCEEDINGS

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CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Okay. We're back on.

And let's move to Item Number 5. And, staff. Lisa.

MR. GRAVES: Good morning, Commissioners.

CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: You're not Lisa.

MR. GRAVES: Robert Graves with Commission

Item 5 is staff's recommendation concerning a proposed resolution of issues put forth by Florida Power & Light, the Office of Public Counsel and the Office of the Attorney General. The resolution which is attached to the recommendation states that FPL will bear the replacement power costs attributable to the February 26th, 2008, outage. The amount of replacement power costs and the method of refunding these costs are not contemplated in this recommendation, but will be deliberated at a hearing currently scheduled for the 17th and 18th of March. Staff is recommending that the Commission adopt the proposed resolution.

And one quick note, since the filing of staff's recommendation, the Florida Industrial Power Users Group has adopted the resolution.

> CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Commissioner Skop. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you, Madam Chair.

FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION

I just have a couple of questions probably directed to Public Counsel, maybe Ms. Bradley and staff on the proposed resolution of issues. And I think my concern would be that I know that this issue seems to address only the replacement power costs. But the Commission -- again, the day the outage happened I wrote a letter to the Chairman requesting that we conduct an investigation and that was not done, so, you know, FERC and FRCC investigated.

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But I'm not sure from the Commission's perspective outside of replacement power costs, which are the subject of this docket, if there are any other additional costs that, that would come into play. And, and that's my concern with the proposed stipulation here that have been entered into by the parties.

If you look at 1A, you know, essentially FPL does not admit imprudence or any other improper action or failure with regard to the event or reserves its rights and, you know, just basically discusses that this is in relation to replacement power costs.

I just want to make sure that Public Counsel or the Attorney General's Office are not asking the Commission or themselves to give away any other rights. And the point I'd like to make is that with respect to the event in question, you know, certainly there was an

incident at the substation, and that begs a question, you know, who, who incurs the costs for repairing the substation? Is that a separate issue? Have we not got to that? Are we giving away any rights in relation to those other things that to my knowledge we haven't even looked at? Not that I really want to, but, again, I think it's, it's a question that is relevant to ask to the extent that we're not giving anything up here.

MR. BECK: Commissioner, Charlie Beck with the Office of Public Counsel. And, Commissioner, I think the short answer to that is those, those sorts of matters are not addressed one way or the other by this agreement.

Again, this agreement, this, this docket is a spinoff from the fuel docket. And so the only issue that we purported to look at is the replacement fuel outage costs. And we viewed this as similar to, as you would in a civil suit, you would have a liability stage and a damages phase. And this agreement I think settles the liability phase without FPL admitting imprudence or not. They're simply accepting liability for it so that we can move on to the damages phase as it were. As far as anything else, it's not part of the agreement in one way or the other.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. And I just wanted

1	to make sure that, you know, if other issues were to
2	arise, that by virtue of entering into this agreement
3	that neither the parties nor the Commission would be
4	precluded from addressing those issues as a result of
5	this agreement.
6	MR. BECK: That's my understanding.
7	COMMISSIONER SKOP: All right. Thank you. I
8	have no further questions.
9	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Mr. Butler, any
10	comments?
11	MR. BUTLER: I agree with Mr. Beck's
12	characterization. That's how we understand it as well.
13	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Okay. Ms. Bradley?
14	MS. BRADLEY: I would concur.
15	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Okay. Any discussion or
16	comments, questions? Okay. Do I have a motion?
17	COMMISSIONER SKOP: Move to approve staff
18	recommendation for Issues 1 and 2.
19	COMMISSIONER STEVENS: Second.
20	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: All those in favor, say
