- 4. Petitioner received notice of this docket by a review of the Public Service Commission's (Commission) website.
- 5. Statement of Substantial Interests. SACE is a non-profit corporation organized under the laws of the State of Tennessee and authorized to conduct operations in Florida. The mission of SACE is to promote responsible energy choices that solve global warming problems and ensure clean, safe and healthy communities throughout the Southeast, including the State of Florida. SACE has staff working on this mission in Tennessee, North Carolina, Georgia, South Carolina, and Florida. SACE has a substantial membership base in Florida dedicated to the promotion of responsible energy choices.
- 6. SACE advocates for adoption, implementation, and enforcement of meaningful energy policy, during the course of which they have presented experts and provided testimony in numerous forums in Florida, including before the Governor's Climate and Energy Action Team, the Florida State Legislature, the Department of Environmental Protection, and this Commission. SACE places an especially high priority on the importance of thoroughly evaluating all cost-effective energy efficiency programs as a means of mitigating or displacing the need for new, non-renewable electricity generation. SACE was granted intervention and participated in the recently concluded case: *In re: Commission Review of Numeric Conservation Goals*, Docket Nos. 080407 080413, which produced Commission Order No. PSC-09-0855-FOF-EG.
- 7. In this case, the Commission will review the demand side management (DSM) plans of Progress Energy Florida (PEF) has submitted in response to Order No. PSC-09-0855-FOF-EG. Proper program design and implementation is critical to PEF meeting the conservation goals established by the Commission in a cost effective manner.

The bill impacts alleged by PEF in its program filing of March 30, 2010 are significantly greater than those of similar programs in other states. If PEF's programs are not well designed or implemented, the delivery of cost-effective energy efficiency in Florida will suffer.

- 8. The interests of members of SACE are the type of interests this proceeding is designed to protect. Ameristeel Corp. v. Clark, 691 So.2d 473 (Fla. 1997); Agrico Chemical Co. v. Department of Environmental Regulation, 406 So.2d 478 (Fla. 2d DCA 1981), reh. denied, 415 So.2d 1359 (Fla. 1982); Florida Home Builders Ass 'n v. Department of Labor and Employment Security, 412 So.2d 351, 353-54 (Fla. 1982). The purpose of this case is to review and approve appropriate DSM programs, which include efficiency programs. Therefore, the purpose of the proceeding coincides with the substantial interests of SACE.
- 9. <u>Disputed Issues of Material Fact</u>. Disputed issues of material fact include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. What are the rate and bill effects of PEF's proposed DSM plans?
 - b. Are PEF's proposed DSM plans designed to deliver energy efficiency programs in a cost effective manner?
- 10. <u>Statement of Ultimate Facts Alleged</u>. Ultimate facts alleged include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. Should PEF's DSM plans be approved as filed?
- 11. <u>Rules and statutes justifying relief.</u> The rules and statutes that entitle SACE to intervene and participate in this case include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a. Sections 366.80-.85, Florida Statutes;
- b. Section 120.569, Florida Statute;
- c. Section 120.57, Florida Statute;
- d. Rule 25-22.039, Florida Administrative Code
- e. Rule 28-106.21, Florida Administrative Code
- 12. <u>Relief.</u> SACE respectfully requests that it be permitted to intervene as a full party in this docket.

WHEREFORE, SACE respectfully request that the Commission enter an order granting it leave to intervene and participate in this docket as a full party.
