# TAMPA ELECTRIC COMPANY'S MOTION FOR TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER

Tampa Electric Company ("Tampa Electric" or "the company"), pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, hereby moves the Commission for entry of a Temporary Protective Order with respect to all information contained on pages printed on yellow paper stock and marked "CONFIDENTIAL" in red being provided this date to Office of Public Counsel ("OPC") in response to OPC's Second Request for Production of Documents (Nos. 10-15), said confidential information hereinafter referred to as "Confidential Information."

### **Description of Confidential Information**

All information on pages marked "CONFIDENTIAL" separately submitted in response to OPC's Second Request for Production of Documents (Nos. 10-15). The Confidential Information is contained on Bates stamp pages 220-285, being provided to OPC as part of Tampa Electric's response to OPC's Production of Documents Request No. 10. Since all of the information on the pages marked "CONFIDENTIAL" is entitled to confidential protection, Tampa Electric has printed them on yellow paper stock. In support of this request, the company states:

1. Subsection 366.093(1), Florida Statutes, provides that any records "found by the Commission to be propriety confidential business information shall be kept confidential and shall DOCUMENT NUMBER-DATE

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be exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes [requiring disclosure under the Public Records Act]." Proprietary confidential business information includes, but is not limited to "[i]nformation concerning... contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the public utility or its affiliates to contract for goods or services on favorable terms." Subsection 366.093(3)(d), Florida Statutes. Proprietary confidential business information also includes "[i]information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information." Section 366.093(3)(e), Florida Statutes. The Confidential Information that is the subject of this motion falls within the statutory categories and, thus, constitutes propriety confidential business information entitled to protection under Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code.

WHEREFORE, Tampa Electric Company moves for the entry of a temporary protective order pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(6)(c), Florida Administrative Code, protecting the Confidential Information from public disclosure.
