CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: And we are going to move on to Item 3. Mr. Garl.

MR. GARL: Thank you, Madam Chairman. I'm Steve Garl with Commission staff.

Commissioners, Item 3 is a petition from Progress Energy Florida requesting approval of a modification to the purchased power agreement with Pinellas County Resource Recovery, PCRR. The modification reduced PCRR's committed capacity from 54.75 megawatts to 36.5 megawatts from mid-December until -- or, excuse me, mid-September until mid-December of 2009 when PCRR made capital improvements to its generating facility.

Staff recommends approval of the modification because the capacity curtailment did not impact Progress' system reliability and the agreement modification saved Progress' customers \$2.6 million.

Staff and Progress Energy representatives are available for any questions.

CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Thank you.

Commissioners? Commissioner Skop.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you, Madam

■ Chair.

Just with respect to the capacity payment, based on the timing of that reduced capacity payment, would it be correct to understand that because it was at the end of last year the true-up will be in this year's fuel and capacity clause recovery issue?

MR. GARL: Yes, sir.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. All right.

So -- all right. That's the only question I had.

And, again, I wanted to commend staff for taking a detailed look at this, and also Progress for saving their customers \$2.6 million.

Typically, you know, when you have a power purchase agreement you would not depart, but in this case based on the integrated resource planning and the margin -- the reserve margin it was more appropriate for Progress to do what it did. And the resultant savings to the customers are \$2.6 million, and that will be reflected in the aggregate of the amount that is in the fuel and capacity cost-recovery clause proceedings that we'll handle later this year. So I appreciate the efforts from all the parties. Thank you, Madam Chair.

CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Thank you. The parties? Nobody. Commissioner Edgar?
