

100005-WS COMMISSIONERS

Pursuant to Section 367.081 (4) (a), Florida Statutes, water and sewer utilities are permitted to adjust the rates it charges to its customers without those customers bearing the additional expense of a public hearing. These adjustments in rates would depend on increases or decreases in non-controllable expenses subject to inflationary pressures such as chemicals and other general operation and maintenance costs. In addition, pursuant to Section 367.081 (4) (b), Florida Statutes, water and wastewater utilities are permitted to pass-through, without a public hearing, a change in rates resulting from:

- an increase or decrease in rates charged for utility services received from a governmental agency or another regulated utility and which services were redistributed by the utility to its customers;
- an increase or decrease in the rates that it is charged for electric power, the amount of ad valorem taxes
  assessed against its used and useful property, the fees charged by the Department of Environmental Protection
  in connection with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Program, or
- the regulatory assessment fees imposed upon it by the Commission; and
- costs incurred for water quality or wastewater quality testing required by the Department of Environmental Protection.

On May 17, 2010 Lake Utility Services, Inc. filed its notice of intention with the Florida Public Service Commission to increase water and wastewater rates in Lake County pursuant to this Statute. The filing is subject to review by the Commission Staff for accuracy and completeness. If approved by the Commission, water rates will increase by approximately 1.48% and wastewater rates will increase by approximately 1.13%. These rates should be reflected on your bills for service rendered on or after July 21, 2010.

#### COMPLAINT INFORMATION

Complaint: Other Complaint against Lake Utility Services, Inc.

Details:

I am writing on behalf of the residents of South Lake County who are customers of Lake Utility Services, Inc., concerning their recently requested rate increase: Docket No 100005-WS, Order No. PSC-10-0104-PAA-WS. We are informing you that we are opposing the rate increase.

Your job as a Commission is to ensure that our utilities remain affordable, and our water has not. There was recently a huge increase that has negatively impacted many of us. Now they want to increase it even more. We are living in an area with extremely high unemployment and a high foreclosure rate. Even a small increase will have a terrible impact on our community. Perhaps it is time for Lake Utility Services, Inc. to cut their internal expenses, as opposed to passing the buck on to us, especially since we have no other company from which to purchase our water.

We are also quite concerned that our rates have increased considerably since Niagra Bottling Company has been removing water from the aquifer (for free) and selling it for a profit. Perhaps they should pay a percentage of their profits to Lake Utility Services, Inc., rather than having us pay. That would be the fairest way to deal with Lake Untility Services, Inc. increase in expenses.
