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CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: And we are going to take up Issue 12 first so that people don't have to hang

around while we go through all of the DSM issues. So I'm sorry, staff. We'll give everybody a couple of

minutes to get together.

And while we're doing that, I know we have some people on the phone I think from Wal-Mart; just bear with us and we'll get to the DSM issues as soon as possible.

(Pause.)

Ms. Hudson.

MS. HUDSON: Good morning, Commissioners.

CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Good morning.

MS. HUDSON: Shannon Hudson on behalf of Commission staff. Item Number 12 is a staff-assisted rate case for CWS Communities doing business as Palm Valley Utilities. Staff has an oral modification that has been previously provided to all the parties.

Representatives from the utility are here to answer any questions, if the Commission has any questions for them. They are not here to address the Commission. Also, OPC is here as well. Staff is prepared to answer any questions you may have at this time.

CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Okay. Any questions, Commissioners?

Commissioner Skop.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you, Madam Chair.

Just a few questions for staff. And on page 3 of the staff recommendation, the bottom of the first paragraph indicates the annual report with gross revenues for water and wastewater with net income, positive net income for water and a net loss for wastewater. Can staff explain that a little bit?

MS. HUDSON: I'm sorry. Repeat the question.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. On page 3 of the staff recommendation, first paragraph, the last sentence, the Palm Valley 2009 Annual Report reflects total gross revenues for water and wastewater and it reflects a positive income for water, but a let, excuse me, a net loss for wastewater, and I'm trying to gain a better understanding for why that would be.

MS. HUDSON: The utility has a net loss for wastewater after all O&M expenses, depreciation and amortization have been taken into consideration. Other than -- staff doesn't really have any other explanation as to why they have a loss. I guess that's why they're here, to increase their rates to cover their O&M expense and earn a return on their investment.

commissioner skop: Okay. And was there, I guess, in the staff analysis some discussion or corrections to, to I guess better balance, for lack of a better word, some of the accounting issues? I think that during the briefing yesterday that came up.

MS. HUDSON: We met several times with some of the customers of the utility and that was one of their issues, having a hard time following from year to year the annual report, the utility recording different information in different accounts. And the utility updated their 2009 Annual Report to reflect the correct balances.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. All right. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Can you go over the increases, what the current costs for water and sewer are, and then tell me what the recommended amounts are again, please?

MS. BRUCE: Good morning, Madam Chairman.

CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Good morning.

MS. BRUCE: Currently a wastewater customer at average consumption pays approximately \$23. Based on our proposed rates, the new bill would be about \$48.18, which would be an increase of about \$25.20 for increase.

CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: That's for the

1	wastewater?
2	MS. BRUCE: Yes. Wastewater.
3	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Okay. Any increase in
4	the water?
5	MS. BRUCE: Excuse me?
6	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: In the, just in the
7	water service.
8	MS. BRUCE: Just wastewater. And for the
9	water we just did an across-the-board increase. So the
10	wastewater, BFC and the wastewater, water charge
11	gallonage charge, I'm sorry. There was a small revenue
12	requirement increase of 5.29, 5.29, and we just applied
13	those. They
14	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: I'm sorry. When was the
15	last time that the company, the utility had an increase
16	for wastewater?
17	MS. BRUCE: The utility's last rate case was
18	in 2000. They have applied for some price index
19	increases. The last one they did was in 2007.
20	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: And what was it that
21	they received then?
22	MS. HUDSON: A price index.
23	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: A price index.
24	MS. HUDSON: Uh-huh.
25	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Okay. I'm sorry.

And -- okay. That's all I need. Any other questions? 1 2 Commissioner Skop. 3 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you, Madam Chair. Just to staff, so on page 40 of the staff 4 5 recommendation, the majority of the proposed rate 6 increase in the instant case before us deals primarily 7 with the changes to wastewater rates; is that correct? 8 MS. HUDSON: That's correct. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Okay. 9 10 CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Well, Commissioner Skop, 11 is there any, forgive me because I forgot which one I 12 went through now looking at some of the others, was 13 there an indication that anything of the consumers, I 14 know there were some complaints previously about meters, 15 has that died down and are the customers generally 16 satisfied? 17 MS. BRUCE: From my understanding, the 18 customers are satisfied and they support staff's 19 recommendation. 20 CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: Okay. Thank you. 21 Commissioner Skop. 22 COMMISSIONER SKOP: Madam Chair, at this time 23 if there's no further questions, I'd respectfully move 24 the staff recommendation on Item 12. 25 CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: A second?

1	COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Second.
2	COMMISSIONER EDGAR: And that would include
3	the oral modification?
4	COMMISSIONER SKOP: Yes.
5	CHAIRMAN ARGENZIANO: A second to the oral
6	modification. All those in favor, say aye.
