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## PROCEEDINGS

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MS. COLE: Good morning. My name is Ann Cole. I'm the Commission Clerk for the Public Service Commission, and I call this Commission Conference to order.

The first item for business is Item Number 1, the election and term of the Chairman. Are there any nominations?

Commissioner Edgar, you're recognized.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Ms. Cole. And although you've been with us a number of years, you clearly have forgotten the time-honored PSC Commission rule that we start about three minutes late. (Laughter.) That's called PSC time.

Good morning, Commissioners, interested participants. I have a few comments I'd like to make, and then I do have a nomination.

The statutes define the PSC Chair as the administrative head of the agency. Like competence and integrity, what this means in practice is sometimes in the eye of the beholder. It also means that each person who serves as Chair brings to it their own unique personality and experiences.

My own experience and my belief is that the role of Chair is by definition and by practical

necessity a role of leadership. It takes leadership to keep the trains running on time and to keep the ship of state afloat. It takes leadership to know when as part of a collegial body to debate and it takes leadership to know when to let go. It takes leadership to work for consensus, when appropriate, and it takes leadership to look beyond the headlines of today to the issues of tomorrow.

Like many long-standing institutions, the Florida PSC has traditions and practices established over time that guide function over whim, and this is a good and honorable thing. But, likewise, we have the responsibility and flexibility to exercise independent judgment and discretion in keeping with the statutes, which is also good and honorable.

Commissioners, it is our responsibility today to determine amongst ourselves which of us will serve in the administrative role as Chair from today forward. As with all of our decisions, we must look to the statutes for guidance.

There are two ways to interpret the statutes as to the term of office for our next Chair. Both are reasonable interpretations and, as such, the statutes give us, as independently appointed Commissioners, discretion to determine the administrative governance

for the Commission at this unique point in time.

The issues before us today and ahead of us will be a part of Florida's energy, environmental and economic future for decades to come. In two months, four out of the five of us Commissioners will have had an average of less than six months in this job. We must look beyond individual aspirations and strive for a reality and a function that will facilitate a focus on real issues, on real impacts and on real decisions.

And so, Commissioners, with those thoughts I ask for your support as I now make the motion that we elect our colleague Commissioner Art Graham to serve as Chair of this Commission to assume the responsibilities, duties and privileges the role requires for a term to begin immediately today and to extend until January 1 of 2012.

Thank you, Ms. Cole.

MS. COLE: Do we have a second?

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: I will second that.

MS. COLE: Thank you.

Is there any discussion? Commissioner Skop.

COMMISSIONER SKOP: Thank you, Madam Chairman.

Commissioners, this is the third time that I've had the opportunity to vote to elect a Chairman during my term on the Commission. Never once has there

been a debate or discussion on the issue. The long-standing tradition of the Commission has been that the most senior Commissioner who has not yet served as Chairman is unanimously elected the next Chairman. That is how Lisa Edgar was elected Chairman, that is how Matt Carter succeeded her as Chairman, and that is how Nancy Argenziano succeeded him as Chairman.

As to the decision before us today, I respectfully note that I'm the most senior Commissioner that not yet -- that has not yet had the opportunity to serve as Chairman. Obviously if my colleagues wish to afford me the traditional courtesy and honor of serving as Chairman during the remaining two months of my term, I would have welcomed the opportunity to serve the Commission in this capacity. As it turns out, however, alternatively, as predicted, if the Commission desired to depart from long-standing tradition and move in a different direction, it's certainly within its prerogative and discretion to do so.

In either case, I will cast my vote reflecting upholding the long-standing tradition of this Commission in the same manner in which I afforded this courtesy to more senior members who have served before me. Thank you.

MS. COLE: Any further discussion?

1 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Commissioners -- excuse 2 me. Thank you, Ms. Cole. 3 Commissioners, I have made a motion. I recognize that we have a second. And, again, I ask for 4 5 your support. And, Commissioner Graham, I hope that you will 6 7 appreciate and step up to the challenge willingly, and I look forward to working with you. And, Commissioners, I 8 9 would call the question and again ask for your support. MS. COLE: We have a nomination on the floor 10 to elect Commissioner Graham as Chairman for a term 11 ending December 31st, 2011. All those in favor --12 No. Well, okay. I said 13 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: 14 January 1, 2012, because I thought that was the way the statute was written. But either December 31st, 2011, 15 or January 1, 2012 --16 17 MS. COLE: Okay. COMMISSIONER EDGAR: -- whichever is most in 18 keeping with the statute, and I believe that's 19 20 consistent. MS. COLE: Thank you. All those in favor, say 21 22 aye. 23 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Aye. 24 COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Aye. 25 COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Aye.

1 MS. COLE: All opposed. COMMISSIONER SKOP: Aye. 2 MS. COLE: Commissioner Graham has been 3 elected Chairman by a vote of two to one. 4 5 Congratulations, Chairman. COMMISSIONER EDGAR: I think that may be three 6 7 to one, but --MS. COLE: Three to one. I apologize. 8 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: That's okay, Ms. Cole. 9 We have put you in a role that is a little different --10 MS. COLE: A little different. 11 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: -- from the work that you 12 13 usually do for us. And I appreciate you stepping up to this task as well. 14 MS. COLE: Congratulations, Chairman Graham. 15 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you. 16 17 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: All right. 18 (Applause.) CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Well, now, Ms. Cole, I have 19 20 to admit that, yes, I did vote for myself. A little apprehensively, but, yes, I did. 21 Wow, fellow Commissioners, I want to number 22 one thank you, Commissioner Edgar, for those lovely 23 words and for the nomination, and for, Commissioner 24

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Brisé, for the second.

I, I, I hope to not disappoint you but to lead you into the path that I think that our, our, our friends over in the House and in the Senate want us to go. And with that being said, I think we should jump straight into this agenda. I see we have a lot of people out there. And, everybody, I promise you that this meeting will be longer than a minute.
