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CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Next item up is Item Number

10. Please note that we have already deferred Issue 5

of Item Number 10.

MR. DOWDS: Good morning, Commissioners. Dave Dowds with Commission Staff.

I'd like to introduce the analyst that will do the introduction to this item, Melissa L'Amoreaux. This is her first presentation.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: That's all right. This is my first meeting chairing. It's all right.

MS. L'AMOREAUX: Good morning, Commissioners.
Melissa L'Amoreaux with Staff.

Item 10 is staff's recommendation regarding the updated storm hardening plans of Progress Energy Florida, Tampa Electric Company, Florida Public Utilities Company and Gulf Power Company.

Rule 25-6.0342, also known as the storm
hardening rule, requires all Florida investor-owned
utility companies or IOUs to file updated storm
hardening plans every three years with the Commission.
The storm hardening rule requires that each plan contain
a description of the IOU's construction standards,
policies, practices and procedures to enhance the

reliability of overhead and underground electrical transmission and distribution facilities.

This recommendation addresses the IOUs' plan updates as required by the storm hardening rule. Staff recommendation addresses the company's wooden pole inspection program, ten storm hardening initiatives, National Electric Safety Code compliance, extreme wind loading standards, mitigation of flood and storm damage, facility placement, deployment strategies and attachment standards and procedures.

Staff recommends the Commission approve the four investor-owned utilities' updated storm hardening plans. Staff is available for any questions.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you.

To the board, any questions? Commissioner Edgar.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you, Mr. Chair.

Actually just a, a very brief comment, although I am appreciative of the representatives of the companies that are here in case there are other questions.

I would just like to note that the updated plans that are before us are largely a continuation of the current Commission-approved plans, which is a result of an initiative that we began back in '96 after the

storms of '94 and '95. That at that time was and continues to be a multifaceted collaborative approach that had participation from a broad base of citizens, local governments, communities and businesses.

At the time that we embarked on that initiative as a Commission with support and interest from many, many, many participants, we knew that strengthening our electric infrastructure would be and should be an ongoing process and one that should provide good value over time to the ratepayers.

I am appreciative of the continued work of the companies and all of the interest groups that continue to work with them, particularly local governments that provide their input and points of contact and communication, and I'm just glad to see this good work continue.

And I'm glad to make a motion, Mr. Chair, at the appropriate time.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, Commissioner Edgar.

Any other questions or concerns? Seeing none, Commissioner Edgar, it looks like you're up.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. Then I would move Staff on Issues 1 through 4, recognizing that we are deferring Issue 5, and modify Issue 6 so that the

MR. KONUCH: Commissioner, Commissioner Edgar.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Oh, yes.

MR. KONUCH: I, I would just like to state for the record -- this is Dave --

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Sir, sir, your name.

MR. KONUCH: Dave Konuch from Florida Cable Telecom Association.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you.

MR. KONUCH: And that as regards the attachment standards and procedures, as was the case with the last storm hardening cycle, FCTA had entered into stipulations with all of the IOUs. And we've, we've worked to do that again this time, so we've been negotiating with everybody. And we have agreements assigned with all but one of the IOUs, and we've been negotiating and working on it even up until the beginning of this, this meeting.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Good.

MR. KONUCH: So as of right now we believe that, we hope that we will reach accord with that final IOU. If we cannot, then we may have to file something before the PAA deadline elapses. But right now we're continuing to negotiate and we feel pretty good about our chances of getting that done.

1 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. If I may Thank you, Mr. Konuch. And I'm sorry that I 2 didn't see that you were trying to get our attention. 3 appreciate you highlighting that point. And I also 4 think that that highlights some of my comments that this 5 is a collaborative approach with a broad array of 6 7 stakeholders that are working. If you are not able to 8 all reach agreement on that issue, you know we will be here to hear all concerns and discuss them. But I 9 appreciate your comments and that everybody is working 10 11 together to move it forward. 12 MR. KONUCH: Thank you. 13

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Are there any other comments? I just wanted to make sure I didn't overlook anybody's hand.
