2	(1) All records that a utility is required to keep, by reason of these or other rules
3	prescribed by the Commission, shall be kept at the office or offices of the utility within this

14	date. When there is good reason for doing so, estimated bills may be submitted. If bill is
15	estimated, it shall be so-marked.
16	(2) Whenever for any reason the period of service for which a bill is rendered is less
17	than fifty percent (50%) of the normal billing period, the charges applicable to such service,
18	including minimum charges, shall be pro-rated in the proportion that the actual number of
