Florida Power & Light Company's ("FPL's") 2011 Ten Year Power Plant Site Plan ("Site Plan") filed April 1, 2011, included a resource planning assumption that FPL would need to begin scheduling planned maintenance of its generating units during all summer months. Subsequently, FPL has determined that under current operating parameters the required maintenance may be performed during the non-summer months. All other things equal, this correction would lower FPL's projected resource needs in 2016 and subsequent years, as reflected in the Site Plan, by 350 MW of capacity. FPL is in the process of assessing its long term generation needs in a more detailed fashion. This work, which has not been concluded, will ultimately determine whether FPL's next planned generating unit will be required in 2016 or 2017.
