FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF MATERIALS PROVIDED PURSUANT TO AUDIT NO. 11-005-4-3

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (2011) ("Section 366.093"), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (2011) ("Rule 25-22.006"), Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") requests confidential classification of certain material provided to the Staff of the Florida Public Service Commission ("Staff") pursuant to Audit Control No. 11-005-4-3 ("the Audit"). In support of this request, FPL states as follows:

1. During the Audit, FPL provided Staff with various confidential documents. By letter dated May 17, 2011, Staff indicated its intent to retain certain audit work papers. Pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(3)(a), FPL was given 21 days from the date of the letter to file a formal request for confidential classification with respect to the work papers. Accordingly, FPL files this Request for Confidential Classification to maintain continued confidential handling of the confidential work papers.

2. The following exhibits are included with and made a part of this request:

a. Exhibit A includes a copy the confidential documents, on which all information that is entitled to confidential treatment under Florida law has been highlighted.

b. Exhibit B consists of a copy of the confidential documents, on which all information that is entitled to confidential treatment under Florida law has been redacted.

c. Exhibit C is a table that identifies the specific line and page references to the confidential materials for which FPL seeks confidential treatment. The table also references

the specific statutory basis or bases for the claim of confidentiality and the affidavits in support of the requested classification.

d. Exhibit D includes the affidavits of Damaris Rodriguez, Antonio Maceo, Solomon L. Stamm, Gregory N. Dulin, Frank J. Nesbihal, J. Carine Bullock, Scott E. Brown and Roger F. Messer.

3. FPL submits that the highlighted information in Exhibit A is proprietary confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3). This information is intended to be and is treated by FPL as private, and its confidentiality has been maintained. Pursuant to Section 366.093, such information is entitled to confidential treatment and is exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

4. As the affidavits included in Exhibit D indicate, certain information provided by FPL contains information related to internal auditing controls or reports of internal auditors. This information is protected from public disclosure pursuant to Section 366.093(3)(b). Other materials contain information related to security measures, systems, and procedures. Such information is protected from public disclosure pursuant to Section 366.093(3)(c). Certain materials also contain information related to bids or contractual data, such as pricing or other terms, the public disclosure of which would violate nondisclosure terms of FPL's contracts with certain vendors and impair FPL's ability to contract for goods or services on favorable terms in the future. Such information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(d).

5. Much of this information is also competitively sensitive, and could impair the competitive interests of the provider of the information. Such information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(e). Additionally, some documents contain information that relates to customer specific account information. It is FPL's policy not to disclose customer-specific information, except as required by law, to entities or persons other than the customer absent the customer's consent. The policy includes but is not limited to: customer names, addresses, telephone numbers, account numbers, rates, billing determinants (kW and kWh usage), conservation savings in kW, kWh, and bills. FPL's policy is premised upon customers' right to privacy and the potential that disclosure of customer specific information may harm some customers' competitive interests. This information is protected pursuant to Section 366.093(3)(e).

6. Additionally, a few documents include competitively sensitive information related to certain employees' compensation. Public disclosure of compensation information would enable competing employers to meet or beat the compensation offered by FPL, resulting in the loss of talented employees, or conversely, the need to increase the level of compensation already paid in order to retain these employees and attract new talent. Higher wages would ultimately result in higher rates for consumers. Disclosure may also adversely affect employee morale and result in infighting among employees who have the same position but varying wages. This information, too, is protected pursuant to Section 366.093(3)(e).

7. Upon a finding by the Commission that the information highlighted in Exhibit A, and referenced in Exhibit C, is proprietary confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for a period of at least eighteen (18) months and should be returned to

FPL as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. See § 366.093(4), Fla. Stat. (2011).

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials and affidavits included herewith, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its Request for Confidential Classification be granted
