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## PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Item No. 11.

MR. FRANKLIN: Good morning, Chairman and Commissioners. Kenneth Franklin with Staff.

Item 11 addresses the midcourse correction filed by Florida Power & Light to make an adjustment to its 2012 fuel factors. Midcourse corrections are a part of the fuel clause proceeding, and such corrections are used by the Commission between fuel hearings whenever costs deviate from revenues by a significant margin.

Utilities must notify the Commission whenever it expects to experience an underrecovery or overrecovery greater than 10%. FPL states that the projected 2012 year-end overrecovery results in an 11.4 midcourse percent. Staff recommends the Commission approve FPL's petition for midcourse correction to its 2012 fuel factors. The revised fuel factors should become effective with the first billing cycle in January 2012. The recommended fuel factors are presented in Attachment A of Staff's recommendation, and Staff is available for any questions that you may have.

MR. BUTLER: Good morning, Mr. Chairman,

Commissioners. John Butler on behalf of Florida Power &

Light Company. We concur with Staff's recommendation,

and we, too, are available for any questions that you

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CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commissioners?

Commissioner Brisé.

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

I guess the most important question for me is what is the impact on consumers?

MR. FRANKLIN: From the -- as far as the 1000-kilowatt-hour residential monthly bill, the, from the factors that were approved in the November fuel hearing, the fuel component that was approved in November was 37.96, and that will be decreasing to 33.43, if, if the Staff recommendation is approved.

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. So that sounds like a -- let's move that to the, to an actual customer bill and see what the impact is on a customer as they would see it on their bill.

MR. FRANKLIN: As they would see it on their bill, the fuel portion would be, would move from 37.96 to 33.43, which is a decrease of \$4.53. Total bill impact would go from \$99.26 to 94.62.

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. And that would be effective when?

MR. FRANKLIN: That would be effective the first billing cycle of January 2012.

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: So they would be, the

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customers will be at the beginning of the year in essence getting a reduction in terms of the cost of power for them?

MR. FRANKLIN: Yes, sir. That's correct.

COMMISSIONER BRISÉ: Okay. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Commissioner Balbis.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. And thank you, Commissioner Brisé. That's, those are the questions I had. I think it's good to point out that customers are going to see a reduction in their bills coming up in January, and I want to thank Florida Power & Light for moving forward expeditiously with this request.

Just a small question I have for Staff.

Florida Power & Light with their West County Energy

Center, I believe Unit 3, we may -- we agreed to allow

them to adjust the fuel savings. Will this affect that

at all, or do they have the flexibility to deal with

that adjustment?

MR. LESTER: Pete Lester with Staff. We did ask Florida Power & Light about that effect on savings, and they had not, as of the time of filing the petition, they had not finalized the effect. They may have something they could comment on today.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Mr. Butler.

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MR. BUTLER: Commissioner Balbis, we have not 1 done that calculation. FPL's understanding of the 2 settlement agreement we entered into that you approved 3 and that was the basis for that recovery is that we do the projection at the time of our normal September 5 filing for projection of the upcoming year. You know, 6 we did that. We have a figure for recovery of the West 7 County 3 costs that are built into the capacity clause 8 recovery factor, and we're not asking for a change in 9 the capacity clause factor. You know, there isn't 10 anything that would change it that would call into 11 question the need for a midcourse correction for the 12 capacity clause recovery. And so we're just, we're not 13 proposing to make an adjustment to the West County 14 3 recovery amount. 15 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Thank you. 16 That's all I had. And with that, I move Staff's 17 recommendation on Issues 1 and 2 for this item. 18 CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: It's been moved and seconded 19 Staff's recommendations on Item No. 11. Any further 20 discussion? Seeing none, all in favor, say aye. 21 22 (Affirmative response.) 23 Any opposed? (No response.) 24 25
