Any questions or comments? 1 Section II, conduct of proceedings. 2 Section III, jurisdiction. 3 Section IV, procedure for handling confidential information. 5 Section V, prefiled testimony and exhibits. 6 7 Section VI, order of witnesses. MR. MURPHY: Commissioner, as the case can be 8 stipulated, unless a Commissioner has specific 9 questions, staff recommends that the witnesses can be 10 excused. We could take that up under the stipulation; 11 that was just for purposes of the record. 12 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. All right. 13 Section VII, basic positions. 14 Section VIII, issues and positions. 15 MR. MURPHY: Commissioner, it's brought to 16 staff's attention that the number for Gulf under Issue 17 4 should be 138,981,347. 18 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Are there any 19 other corrections? 20 MR. MURPHY: Commissioner, there is a 21 question on Staff's Issue 5, and the fallout numbers of 22 that for 3, 4, and 7 as they relate to Progress. 23 think if Mr. Brew will look at staff's language, he may 24 be able to take staff's language that gets to the same 25

point where his language is for Issue 5, and then we would simply be left with the fallout numbers.

MR. BREW: Commissioner, let me explain. For Issue 5, PCS's corrected position should be that the costs of the Anclote conversion project should be depreciated over the remaining life of the assets. And my understanding is that Progress may have some clarifications with respect to that.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Progress?

MR. PERKO: Yes, Commissioner. When this issue was brought to our attention -- we believe that there are two reasonable ways to depreciate the Anclote asset, but when this issue was brought to our attention we were agreeable to the staff's position. So I think Ms. Murphy is correct that if all parties were to agree to staff's language that that would resolve the issue. There's no need to separate out the Anclote project from the other assets.

MR. BREW: Commissioner, I would suggest that I just follow-up with staff at the break to see if we can confirm that that is accurate.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. I don't have a problem with that. We'll take a few minutes after we finish the other sections of this docket before we move to the 01 docket, so at that point if you can just

1 confirm.

2 MR. MURPHY: Yes.

MR. MOYLE: Is it accepted that we will come back after that break and clarify it?

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Yes.

MR. REHWINKEL: Commissioner, Public

Counsel's position will be no position on all issues,
with the very limited caveat that the issue that Mr.

Brew and staff and PEF were working on is
satisfactorily resolved to all parties benefit.

commissioner Balbis: Okay. And just for staff, I want to make sure I understand staff's position on this, because at least the draft prehearing order that I have seems very general, and I want to make sure I understand it, as well.

MR. MURPHY: Yes, sir. As I understand this, Progress' position was that Anclote should be carved out and treated differently, but staff's position was that everything should be depreciated over the life of it unless there is an order saying that it is handled differently, and that this language would do that. If we want to add clarifying language with respect to Anclote, staff does not object to it, but I think we would still have our language for the rest the matters.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Yes. And that's the

language I have from staff, that it's going to be consistent with all the other assets.

MR. MURPHY: Yes, sir.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: And I just want to make sure that Progress understands, because I thought you indicated the five-year depreciation versus the life.

MR. PERKO: Yes, Commissioner, we would be agreeable to staff's position that the same depreciation rates would be used for all assets. There would be no reason to carve out Anclote.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. I think that's pretty clear. I don't know if we really need to --

MR. BREW: To the extent that that is the position and it's clear, then that would be fine. From the earlier discussion, Progress had proposed to break out Anclote, and it wasn't clear to me if staff's statement of the issue was saying that that would not happen. And with that clarification, then we can stipulate to staff's language.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay.

MR. MOYLE: And FIPUG is okay. We have taken no position on that. I think it might just be useful if we know what the proposed depreciation now is on Anclote. If somebody knows that to be seven years or eight years, you know, it would probably clarify

1 things.

MR. BREW: Commissioner, my understanding was that the filing reflected a five-year amortization of Anclote, and that if staff's language is accepted, then we will see corrected schedules.

MR. MURPHY: Yes, sir, there would be corrected schedules, and staff's position with respect to Progress would need to be altered for -- the numbers for 3, 4, and 7. They are fallout numbers that would need to be late-filed subject to review of whoever wanted to see them.

MR. BREW: Right. And that was my understanding was that adopting staff's language would result in the corrected schedules being filed.

MR. PERKO: And, Commissioner, we will be prepared to circulate those revised schedules this afternoon.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. I mean, with that I think everyone is on the same page, so I'm prepared to move on from the issues section of the prehearing order since everyone seems to be clear.

MR. REHWINKEL: With that understanding, Public Counsel has no position on all issues.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Any other questions or comments on Section VIII, issues and positions? Moving

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on to Section IX, exhibit list.

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MR. PERKO: Commissioner, just to make the record clear, Exhibit TGF-3 would be revised in accordance with the agreement that we reached this morning.

MR. MURPHY: And we have a Comprehensive Exhibit List, and just for everyone's peace of mind, it reflects redacted documents in the case of confidential documents and provided to the parties.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Moving on to Section X, proposed stipulations.

MR. MURPHY: Staff proposes that its position be adopted for each issue in the case except Issues 3, 4, and 7 as they relate to Progress. Staff's position is that we would stipulate to whatever the updated numbers are. Staff also proposes that all testimony and exhibits be stipulated into the record, and proposes that all witnesses be excused unless a Commissioner has a question for a specific witness. is staff's understanding that all the utilities agree to this and that the intervenors do not object to this.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. Moving on to Section XI, pending motions.

MR. MURPHY: There are no pending motions at this time.

COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Section XII, pending 1 confidentiality matters. 2 MR. MURPHY: I apologize, but there are 3 several outstanding confidentiality requests, and these 4 will be addressed by separate order. 5 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: And why are they still 6 7 outstanding? I'm just -- (Laughter.) Section XIII, post-hearing procedures. 8 MR. MURPHY: Staff recommends that 9 post-hearing positions should be no longer than 50 10 words set off by asterisks, and post-hearing briefs 11 should be no longer than 40 pages. 12 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Any objections to that? 13 MR. MURPHY: Although I'm told that there 14 probably won't be any post-hearing briefs if it's all 15 stipulated. 16 **COMMISSIONER BALBIS:** Okay. Rulings. 17 might as well address the opening statements. Do 18 parties waive opening statements? I see nods all 19 around. Let the record reflect that parties have 20 waived opening statements. Are there any other 21 22 rulings? No, sir. 23 MR. MURPHY: **COMMISSIONER BALBIS:** Okay. Are there any 24 other matters to address in this docket? 25

MR. MURPHY: Staff is not aware of any. COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Okay. We are going to adjourn this 07 docket and take a five-minute break before moving on to the 01 docket. (The prehearing concluded at 10:28 a.m.)
