PROCEEDINGS 1 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Moving on to Item Number 2 11. 3 MS. DRAPER: Commissioners, Elizabeth 4 Draper with staff. 5 Item 11 is a request by Tampa Electric for 6 7 approval of a special contract with a new manufacturing firm that is considering locating in 8 the Tampa area. TECO has requested that the name of 9 the customer and the term of the contract be treated 10 as confidential information. 11 Staff has reviewed the proposed contract 12 and believes that the charges contained in the 13 contract are reasonable and should be approved. 14 Again, Tampa Electric is here to speak, 15 and I see OPC is at the table, too. 16 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. Commissioner 17 Brown. 18 19 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 20 Ms. Draper, on Page 4 of your 21 22 recommendation, the full third paragraph halfway down -- no, actually, first sentence, sorry, you 23 state that staff believes that the proposed contract 24

will only have a minimal impact on the general body

of ratepayers. I'm just curious how staff has

derived at that summation. Can you possibly

quantify that at this point on what the rate impact

would be on the general body of ratepayers?

MS. DRAPER: Commissioner, I do not believe we can quantify the impact of this customer at this time on the conservation clause, but if I may explain?

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Please.

MS. DRAPER: TECO's interruptible credit is set annually in the conservation docket and it is based on the next avoided unit, which can change.

And this customer, if they choose to locate in the Tampa area, is not expected to come on-line until 2015 or even 2016. We do not know what the credit is going to be in 2016. This contract was negotiated in 2012, and, therefore, the 2012 approved credit is contained in the contract. This contract --

COMMISSIONER BROWN: May I interrupt you for a quick second? Pardon me.

Would the rate case have any impact, then, if it's a 2012 approval of that cost of service -- the future rate case, would that have any implication on this contract?

MS. DRAPER: No, it does not, because the 1 rate case that TECO is proposing to file in this 2 year has a 2014 test year, and, therefore, the 3 customer, if they come on-line in 2015 or 2016, would not be included in the test year. And between 5 rate cases any revenues that TECO -- base revenues 6 7 that TECO may lose does not impact base rates on other customers. And also keep in mind that the 8 customer will pay the otherwise annually approved 9 10 cost-recovery clauses such as fuel, for example, so there is no discount there, and no impact on the 11

COMMISSIONER BROWN: Great.

other ratepayers through the clauses.

Mr. Chairman, does the utility or OPC wish to comment?

MR. BEASLEY: Yes. Thank you.

James Beasley for Tampa Electric Company with Mr. William Ashburn, who is Tampa Electric's Director of Pricing and Financial Analysis.

We want to thank the Commission and its staff for fast-tracking this application. The customer has indicated that they are on the verge of making a decision, and your putting this on the fast-track will enable us to remain in contention in the Tampa Electric service area.

We agree with and endorse your staff's recommendation. This offers some significant economic development opportunities for the Tampa area, and we urge that you approve it.

We'd be happy to answer any questions you may have. And thanks, again, for the expedited treatment.

MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and Commissioners. Charles Rehwinkel, Deputy Public Counsel. I just would like to read a statement on this matter for the record.

The Public Counsel has been closely following the special contract petition filed by Tampa Electric. The Company has provided supporting information and has been helpful to us understanding the nature of the request.

At this time, based on the information provided and filed by TECO, the Public Counsel has perceived no reason to intervene in the docket or to object to the Commission's approval, given the time frames involved and the uncertainties the future brings. We would note that the Commission has ongoing jurisdiction to ensure that TECO abides by the representations made and to protect all customers.

Thank you. 1 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. Thank you. 2 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Thank you. 3 Mr. Chairman, if I could just make a 4 comment? 5 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Sure. 6 7 COMMISSIONER BROWN: I just think this contract could incentivize the company to relocate 8 9 to Tampa, could recreate jobs, could spur economic development. It could be really great for the 10 overall community of the Tampa Bay area, and I'm 11 supportive of the contract as is. 12 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Thank you, Commissioner 13 Brown. 14 15 Commissioner Edgar. 16 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. I think two questions. 17 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Sure. 18 19 **COMMISSIONER EDGAR:** Maybe. The first is to our staff. Is there 20 precedent in past Commission decisions for something 21 22 of this nature? MS. BROWN: Yes, Commissioner, there is. 23 The Commission has approved special 24 contracts filed for gas companies, other electric 25

utilities, and water and wastewater companies under Rule 25-9.034 over -- I went back as far as 1988 and found some cases that approved special contracts.

So, yes, there is precedent for it.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you.

And then the second question, is it correct to say that any other potential future or existing customer for TECO or another IOU that we regulate would have the ability to enter into negotiations for a unique tariff, should there be a desire to do so?

MS. BROWN: Yes. Yes, I think so. The resulting contract would always come to the Commission for approval. And there are, of course, some criteria involved in it --

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Certainly.

MS. BROWN: -- but, yes, they could.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Okay. Then I would also point out that as the proposal is before us, this proposed customer would be taking service at the transmission level, which also avoids other potential costs that would otherwise accrue.

I commend TECO for bringing this forward, appreciate the review by OPC, and I am supportive of the item as proposed.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Thank you, Commissioner Edgar.

Commissioner Graham.

COMMISSIONER GRAHAM: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

I say ditto to some of the things my other Commissioners have already said. This seems like one of those customers you want to chase after. Someone that's going to take 230 kV power straight from the plant, basically. And when it comes to economic development, a customer that's going to come in and bolt down \$10 million worth of equipment, or tens of millions of dollars worth of equipment are ones that are not going to just pack up and leave after about one or two years. Those guys are going to be there forever.

We have had some high-tech jobs up in my neck of the woods that, you know, they fulfilled their contract of three to five years, and then they all unplug and they leave. So this is one of the ones -- and if you look at the average salaries, it's pretty significant how high those average salaries are.

So I encourage this entire dialogue. Thank you.
